### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIBRARIES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Act 246, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005,
2	established a school impact fee working group to develop a
3	template or process for requiring fair share contributions from
4	private land developers of residential developments to defray a
5	portion of the cost of providing department of education
6	facilities.
7	The result of the efforts of the working group was the
8	enactment of Act 245, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, that set
9	forth a new method for financing, in part, new and expanding
10	existing department of education school facilities in
11	partnership with developers of new residential development, by
12	identifying need areas and calculating appropriate school impact
13	fee for new residential developments.
14	The purpose of this Act is to establish a working group to
15	develop a similar template or process for requiring fair share
16	contributions from private developers of residential

developments for the development of public library facilities.

1	(2)	Determine the differing library facility needs for						
2		each district or complex area, including but not						
3		limited to:						
4		(A) New and expanded facility needs;						
5		(B) The needs required by different types and market						
6		groups of residential developments; and						
7		(C) The different type of curricula and programs that						
8		may be required by different types of library						
9		facilities;						
10	(3)	Consider various funding mechanisms and other best						
11		practices utilized by other jurisdictions nationwide						
12		for the provision of library facilities;						
13	(4)	Consider including in the existing school impact fees						
14		process contained in chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised						
15		Statutes, a provision for library impact fees; and						
16	(5)	Any other matters that may be appropriate for the						
17		working group to consider.						
18	SECT	ION 3. The working group shall submit its findings and						
19	recommenda	ations, including any proposed legislation, to the						
20	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of							
21	the regular session of 2010.
