A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 281-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows:		
3	"(f) Class 5. Dispenser license.		
4	(1) A license under this class shall authorize the		
5	licensee to sell liquor specified in this subsection		
6	for consumption on the premises. A licensee under		
7	this class shall be issued a license according to the		
8	category of establishment the licensee owns or		
9	operates. The categories of establishments shall be		
10	as follows:		
11	(A) A standard bar;		
12	(B) Premises in which a person performs or entertains		
13	unclothed or in attire restricted to use by		
14	entertainers pursuant to commission rules;		
15	(C) Premises in which live entertainment or recorded		
16	music is provided; provided that facilities for		

1		dancing by the patrons may be permitted as
2		provided by commission rules; or
3		(D) Premises in which employees or entertainers are
4		compensated to sit with patrons, regardless of
5		whether the employees or entertainers are
6		consuming nonalcoholic beverages while in the
7		company of the patrons pursuant to commission
8		rules.
9	(2)	If a licensee under class 5 desires to change the
10		category of establishment the licensee owns or
11		operates, the licensee shall apply for a new license
12		applicable to the category of the licensee's
13		establishment.
14	(3)	Of this class, there shall be the following kinds:
15		(A) General (includes all liquor except alcohol);
16		(B) Beer and wine; and
17		(C) Beer.
18	(4)	A class 5 licensee shall at all times maintain liquor
19		liability insurance coverage in an amount to be
20		determined every two years pursuant to commission
21		rules; provided that the commission shall not set the
22		amount at less than \$1,000,000."

1	SECTION 2.	Section 281-45,	Hawaii	Revised	Statutes,	is
2	amended to read	as follows:				

- 3 "§281-45 No license issued, when. No license shall be
 4 issued under this chapter:
- 5 To any minor or to any person who has been convicted (1) of a felony and not pardoned (except that the 6 commission may grant a license under this chapter to a 7 corporation that has been convicted of a felony where 8 9 the commission finds that the organization's officers and shareholders of twenty-five per cent or more of 10 outstanding stock are fit and proper persons to have a 11 license), or to any other person not deemed by the 12 13 commission to be a fit and proper person to have a license; 14
- To a corporation the officers and directors of which, 15 (2) or any of them, would be disqualified under paragraph 16 17 (1) from obtaining the license individually, or a stockholder of which, owning or controlling twenty-18 five per cent or more of the outstanding capital 19 20 stock, or to a general partnership, limited 21 partnership, limited liability partnership, or limited liability company whose partner or member holding 22

1		twenty-five per cent or more interest of which, or any
2		of them would be disqualified under paragraph (1) from
3		obtaining the license individually;
4	(3)	Unless the applicant for a license or a renewal of a
5		license, or in the case of a transfer of a license,
6		both the transferor and the transferee, present to the
7		issuing agency a signed certificate from the director
8		of taxation and from the Internal Revenue Service
9		showing that the applicant or the transferor and
10		transferee do not owe the state or federal governments
11		any delinquent taxes, penalties, or interest; [or]
12	(4)	To an applicant for a class 5 dispenser license,
13		unless the applicant for a license or a renewal of a
14		license, or in the case of a transfer of a license,
15		both the transferor and the transferee, present to the
16		issuing agency proof of the liquor liability insurance
17		required by section 281-31(f); or
18	[(4)]	(5) To any applicant who has had any liquor license
19		revoked less than two years previous to the date of
20		the application for any like or other license under
21		this chapter."

SECTION 3. Section 281-61, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended to read as follows: 2 "§281-61 Renewals. (a) Other than for good cause, the 3 renewal of an existing license shall be granted upon the filing 4 of an application; provided that if: 5 Complaints from the public; 6 (1)Reports from the commission's investigators; or 7 (2) (3) Adjudications of the commission or the liquor control 8 adjudication board, 9 indicate that noise created by patrons departing from the 10 premises disturbs residents on the street or of the neighborhood 11 in which the premises are located, or that noise from the 12 premises or adjacent related outdoor areas such as parking lots 13 or lanais exceed standards contained in state or county noise 14 codes or intrudes into nearby residential units, the commission 15 may deny the renewal application or withhold the issuance of a 16 renewed license until corrective measures meeting the 17 commission's approval are taken. 18 The commission or board, pursuant to section 281-17, 19 at the time of renewal or at any time, may revoke, suspend, or 20

place conditions or restrictions on any license issued under

this chapter for the purpose of preventing activities within the

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- 1 licensed premises or adjacent areas that are potentially
- 2 injurious to the health, safety, and welfare of the public and
- 3 neighborhood including but not limited to criminal activity,
- 4 including assault, drug dealing, drug use, or prostitution, upon
- 5 proper notice to the licensee, and a hearing before the
- 6 commission pursuant to chapter 91.
- 7 (c) The commission or board shall deny renewal of a class
- 8 5 dispenser license if the applicant for renewal fails to
- 9 present proof of the liquor liability insurance required by
- 10 section 281-31(f)."
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 12 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 13 begun, before its effective date.
- 14 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
