H.B. NO. 574

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPOSIT BEVERAGE CONTAINER PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the deposit beverage 2 container program has encouraged increased recycling of glass, 3 plastic, and aluminum beverage containers in the State. 4 However, the legislature finds that more could be done to make 5 the recycling program easier and more accessible to the public, 6 thereby encouraging yet more recycling of containers. The 7 legislature finds that access to recycling facilities could be 8 improved by increasing the number of redemption centers and 9 reverse vending machines that are available to the public. 10 Currently, the department of health offers a rebate to qualified 11 persons who install a reverse vending machine and maintain 12 operations as a redemption center. However, this rebate program will expire on June 30, 2009. The legislature finds that 13 14 recycling throughout the State may be increased by extending the 15 reverse vending machine rebate program and increasing its 16 financial incentives. Additionally, the legislature finds that 17 each county has the potential to increase recycling by planning 18 and operating its own recycling programs.

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1	Acco	rdingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
2	(1)	Extend the reverse vending machine rebate program and
3		increase the financial incentives offered by the
4		program; and
5	(2)	Appropriate moneys to the counties to plan and operate
6		county recycling programs.
7	SECT	ION 2. Act 228, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, as
8	amended b	y Act 231, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, is amended by
9	amending	section 6 to read as follows:
10	"SEC	TION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
11	provided	that:
12	(1)	This Act shall be repealed on June 30, [2009,] <u>2012,</u>
13		and section 342G-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall
14		be reenacted in the form in which it read on the day
15		before the effective date of this Act; and
16	(2)	Any action initiated by the department of health
17		pursuant to section 342G-A(e), Hawaii Revised
18		Statutes, shall be allowed to continue until final
19		resolution of the action is achieved."
20	SECT	ION 3. Section 342G-102.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amended b	y amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:



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1	"(a)	The department shall provide a rebate of [fifty] <u>one</u>
2	<u>hundred</u> p	er cent of the actual cost of each reverse vending
3	machine,	including shipping and general excise tax, <u>and up to</u>
4	seventy-f	ive per cent of the operating cost during the first two
5	years for	each reverse vending machine purchased by a person:
6	(1)	That agrees to maintain operations as a certified
7		redemption center for a minimum period of two years;
8		or
9	(2)	That is serviced by a recycler that is a certified
10		redemption center; and
11	(3)	That has entered into a service agreement with the
12		recycler for a minimum period of two years;
13	provided	that rebates shall not exceed \$3,000,000 in the
14	aggregate	in any fiscal year.
15	(b)	A rebate provided under this section shall be granted
16	for a rev	erse vending machine that:
17	(1)	Is installed and operational by December 31, [2007;]
18		2012;
19	(2)	Is accessible to the general public; and
20	(3)	Tenders vouchers or receipts for the returned
21		containers that are redeemable by the person at a
