A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE IDENTIFICATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that state identification
- 2 is vital for seniors, children, and other individuals who do not
- 3 possess a driver's license or other picture identification.
- 4 Currently, obtaining a state identification card (certificate of
- 5 identification) is a lengthy process because processing and
- 6 administration is conducted at a single location with limited
- 7 hours of operation. This leads to long lines and some
- 8 individuals being turned away due to daily demand. There have
- 9 been recent attempts to bring state identification personnel
- 10 into the community, but only for specific dates and times.
- 11 The legislature further finds that Honolulu's satellite
- 12 city halls are convenient locations for state identification
- 13 processing. Satellite city halls provide services with extended
- 14 hours, weekend availability, and convenient locations.
- 15 The authority to process and issue state identification
- 16 cards is vested in the attorney general. The purpose of this
- 17 Act is to allow the attorney general to contract with one or



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1 more counties for the purpose of processing and issuing state 2 identification cards at satellite city halls or other locations. 3 SECTION 2. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 4 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 5 read as follows: 6 "§46- State identification; contracts with State to 7 process and issue. The attorney general may contract with a 8 county for the processing and issuance of state certificates of 9 identification pursuant to section 846-21. Notwithstanding any 10 other law to the contrary, a county may use any appropriate 11 county facility for the purposes of carrying out state 12 identification administration." 13 SECTION 3. Section 846-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended to read as follows: 15 "§846-21 Authority of attorney general. (a) The attorney general shall carry out this part. In conformity with chapter 16 17 76, the attorney general may appoint [such] subordinates, [at 18 such compensation, compensated within the limits of available 19 appropriations [therefor], or without compensation, as may be 20 necessary or proper to carry out this part, and $[\tau]$ the attorney

general may delegate to [such] the subordinates [such of] the

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- 1 attorney general's powers and duties as may be necessary for the
- 2 efficient administration of this part.
- 3 The attorney general may contract with a county for
- 4 the processing and issuance of certificates of identification
- 5 under this part. The attorney general may provide training and
- 6 supervision of county employees related to its duties under this
- 7 part."
- 8 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
