## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERANS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§304A- Veterans scholarship program. (a) There is
5	established a veterans scholarship program to be placed
6	administratively within the University of Hawaii.
7	(b) The University of Hawaii shall provide scholarships to
8	eligible applicants who are residents of the State upon
9	confirmation from an approved educational institution that the
10	applicant has been accepted for enrollment in an approved course
11	of study. Scholarships shall apply only to tuition, books,
12	laboratory fees, and other required educational fees.
13	(c) The University of Hawaii shall identify by rule the
14	approved courses of study, approved educational institutions
15	(including vocational schools), and qualifying fees and costs
16	that are subject to this section.
17	(d) To receive a scholarship under this chapter, an

applicant shall:

18

1	(1)	Maintain a domicile in Hawaii during the term of the
2		scholarship;
3	(2)	Comply with any requirements or conditions placed on
4		the scholarship by the University of Hawaii;
5	(3)	Maintain a grade point average of 2.0 or higher, on a
6		scale of 4.0 or its equivalent; and
7	(4)	Enter into a written agreement with the University of
8		Hawaii to:
9		(A) Satisfy all degree and other requirements under
10		this program; and
11		(B) Reimburse the State for all amounts received
12		under this program and interest thereon, as
13		determined by the University of Hawaii, if the
14		applicant fails to comply with this section.
15	(e)	In addition to the requirements of subsection (d), an
16	applicant	shall have also served as:
17	(1)	A nurse or honorably discharged member of the armed
18		forces of the United States who served during World
19		War I;
20	(2)	A nurse or member of the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps,
21		member of the Women's Auxiliary Volunteer Emergency
22		Service, or an honorably discharged member of the



1		arme	d forces of the United States who served during
2		Worl	d War II;
3	(3)	An h	onorably discharged member of the armed forces of
4		the	United States who served during the Korean war; or
5	(4)	An h	onorably discharged member of the armed forces of
6		the	United States who served on active military duty,
7		excl	uding training, for more than one hundred eighty
8		days	and who served a portion of their active duty
9		duri	ng:
10		(A)	The cold war which began on June 27, 1950, until
11			the end of the Korean war;
12		<u>(B)</u>	The Vietnam era which began on December 21, 1961,
13			and ended on May 7, 1975;
14		(C)	The Grenada and Lebanon era which began on August
15			24, 1982, and ended on July 31, 1984;
16		(D)	The Panama era which began on December 20, 1989,
17			and ended on January 21, 1990;
18		(E)	The Persian Gulf war which began on August 2,
19			1990, and ended on September 1, 1997;
20		<u>(F)</u>	The national emergency by reason of certain
21			terrorist attacks that began on September 11,
22			2001; or



1		(G)	Any other national emergency that involves the
2			United Stated armed forces that is declared in
3			accordance with federal law.
4	(f)	The	scholarship shall also apply and inure to the
5	benefit o	f:	
6	(1)	The	immediate children of members of the armed forces
7		of t	the United States; provided that the members:
8		(A)	Were killed while serving on active duty or died
9			while in service; provided that the deaths are
10			documented and directly caused by illness or
11			injury connected with service in the United
12			States armed forces;
13		(B)	Are missing in action; or
14		(C)	Became totally disabled for purposes of
15			employability according to the disability ratings
16			of the Department of Veterans Affairs as a result
17			of a service-related injury; and
18	(2)	Orph	ans or children of members of the Hawaii national
19		guar	d and Hawaii reserve; provided that the members:
20		(A)	Were killed after January 1, 1946, while on
21		v	active duty either in the service of the State or
22			the United States; or



1	<u>(B)</u>	Are totally disabled for purposes of
2		employability according to the disability ratings
3		of the United States Department of Veterans
4		Affairs, regardless of whether the members are
5		eligible to receive disability benefits from the
6		department as a result of a service-related
7		injury suffered after January 1, 1946, while on
8		active duty either in the service of the State or
9		the United States.
10	(g) The	scholarship is only transferable to another
11	approved educa	tional institution and is limited to funds
12	appropriated f	or the purposes of this section.
13	(h) An a	pplicant shall not receive benefits under this
14	section for mo	re than a cumulative total of one hundred fifty
15	credit hours.	
16	(i) The	scholarship shall not apply to an applicant that
17	receives educa	tional benefits under federal law if the value of
18	those benefits	is equal to or exceeds the scholarship. If the
19	value of the f	ederal benefits does not equal or exceed the value
20	of the scholar	ship, the applicant shall first utilize the
21	federal benefi	t such that the combined amount of the federal

1	benefit plus the amount of the scholarship shall not exceed the
2	maximum value of the scholarship.
3	(j) An applicant is not eligible for a scholarship if the
4	applicant is in default on any:
5	(1) Loan made or guaranteed for educational purposes by
6	the State; or
7	(2) Other debt owed to the University of Hawaii or any
8	approved educational institution.
9	(k) The University of Hawaii shall adopt rules pursuant to
10	chapter 91 to effectuate this section."
11	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
