A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERANS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§304A- Veterans scholarship program. (a) There is
5	established a veterans scholarship program to be placed
6	administratively within the university.
7	(b) The university shall provide scholarships to eligible
8	applicants who are residents of the state who have been accepted
9	for enrollment in the university in an approved course of study.
10	Scholarships shall apply only to tuition, books, laboratory
11	fees, and other required educational fees.
12	(c) To receive a scholarship under this chapter, an
13	applicant shall:
14	(1) Maintain a domicile in Hawaii during the term of the
15	scholarship;
16	(2) Comply with any requirements or conditions of the
17	scholarship;



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1	(3)	Maintain a grade point average of 2.0 or higher, on a
2		scale of 4.0 or its equivalent; and
3	(4)	Enter into a written agreement with the university to:
4		(A) Satisfy all degree and other requirements under
5		this program; and
6		(B) Reimburse the State for all amounts received
7		under this program and interest thereon, as
8		determined by the university, if the applicant
9		fails to comply with this section.
10	(d)	In addition to the requirements of subsection (c), an
11	applicant	shall be a veteran as currently defined by the federal
12	Departmen	t of Veterans Affairs.
13	(e)	The scholarship shall also apply and inure to the
14	benefit o	<u>f:</u>
15	(1)	The children of any current or past member of the
16		armed forces of the United States; provided that the
17		member:
18		(A) Was killed while serving on active duty or died
19		while in service; provided that the deaths are
20		documented and directly caused by illness or
21		injury connected with service in the United
22		States armed forces;
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1		<u>(B)</u>	Is missing in action; or
2		<u>(C)</u>	Became totally disabled for purposes of
3			employability according to the disability ratings
4			of the Department of Veterans Affairs as a result
5			of a service-related injury;
6		and	
7	(2)	Orph	ans or children of any current or past member of
8		the	Hawaii national guard and Hawaii reserve; provided
9		that	the member:
10		<u>(A)</u>	Was killed after January 1, 1946, while on active
11			duty either in the service of the State or the
12			United States; or
13		<u>(B)</u>	Is totally disabled for purposes of employability
14			according to the disability ratings of the United
15			States Department of Veterans Affairs, regardless
16			of whether the members are eligible to receive
17			disability benefits from the department as a
18			result of a service-related injury suffered after
19			January 1, 1946, while on active duty either in
20			the service of the State or the United States.
21	(f)	The	scholarship is limited to funds appropriated for
22	the purpo	ses o	f this section.



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1	(g) An applicant shall not receive benefits under this					
2	section for more than a cumulative total of one hundred fifty					
3	credit hours.					
4	(h) The scholarship shall not apply to an applicant who					
5	receives educational benefits under federal law if the value of					
6	those benefits is equal to or exceeds the scholarship. If the					
7	value of the federal benefits do not equal or exceed the value					
8	of the scholarship, the applicant shall first use the federal					
9	benefits such that the combined amount of the federal benefits					
10	plus the amount of the scholarship shall not exceed the maximum					
11	value of the scholarship.					
12	(i) An applicant is not eligible for a scholarship if the					
13	applicant is in default on any:					
14	(1) Loan made or guaranteed for educational purposes by					
15	the State; or					
16	(2) Other debt owed to the university or any other					
17	approved educational institution.					
18	(j) The university shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter					
19	91 to effectuate this section."					
20	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.					
21	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.
