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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

2		internal management;

4		regard to chapter 91, adopt internal budgetary rules,
5		procedures, and controls to expend funds under the
6		authority's conrol; provided that any rule or
7		procedure in place as of January 1, 2008, shall remain
8		in effect unless amended by the authority with
9		legislative approval;

11		rules in accordance with chapter 91 with respect to

17		appointment of officers, agents, and employees,

20		salaries, without regard to chapters 76 and 78, if

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1		tourism special fund and funds have been appropriated
2		by the legislature and allotted as provided by law;
3	[(8)]	(9) Through its executive director purchase supplies,
4		equipment, or furniture;
5	[(9)]	(10) Through its executive director allocate the space
6		or spaces that are to be occupied by the authority and
7		appropriate staff;
8	[(10)]	(11) Engage the services of qualified persons to
9		implement the State's tourism marketing plan or
10		portions thereof as determined by the authority;
11	[(11)]	(12) Engage the services of consultants on a
12		contractual basis for rendering professional and
13		technical assistance and advice;
14	[(12)]	(13) Procure insurance against any loss in connection
15		with its property and other assets and operations in
16		amounts and from insurers as it deems desirable;

15		sector in the development of tourism-related

17	[(18)]	(19) Work to eliminate or reduce barriers to travel in
18		order to provide a positive and competitive business
19		environment, including coordinating with the
20		department of transportation on issues affecting
21		airlines and air route development;

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1	[(19)]	(20) Market and promote sports-related activities and
2		events;
3	[(20)]	(21) Coordinate the development of new products with
4		the counties and other persons in the public sector
5		and private sector, including the development of
6		sports, culture, health and wellness, education,
7		technology, agriculture, and nature tourism;
8	[(21)]	(22) Establish a public information and educational
9		program to inform the public of tourism and tourism-
10		related problems;
11	[(22)]	(23) Encourage the development of tourism educational,
12		training, and career counseling programs;

14		respond to complaints about problems resulting
15		directly or indirectly from the tourism industry and
