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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REDUCED IGNITION PROPENSITY CIGARETTES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 132C-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as
3	follows:
4	<pre>"[+]\$132C-4[+] Certification; marking[-]; revolving fund.</pre>
5	(a) Each manufacturer shall submit to the state fire council
6	written certification attesting that each cigarette has been
7	tested in accordance with, and has met the performance standard
8	required under section 132C-3. The description of each
9	cigarette listed in the certification shall include:
10	(1) The brand or trade name on the package;
11	(2) Style, such as light or ultra light;
12	(3) Length in millimeters;
13	(4) Circumference in millimeters;
14	(5) Flavor, such as menthol, if applicable;
15	(6) Filter or nonfilter;
16	(7) Package description, such as a soft pack or box;
17	(8) The mark approved pursuant to subsection (b);

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1	(9) The name, address, and telephone number of the	
2	laboratory, if different than the manufacturer that	
3	conducted the test; and	
4	(10) The date that the testing occurred.	
5	Each cigarette certified under this subsection shall be	
6	recertified every three years. For each cigarette listed in a	
7	certification, a manufacturer shall pay to the state fire	
8	council a \$375 fee. The fees shall be deposited into a special	
9	revolving fund hereby created within the state treasury and to	
10	be administered by the state fire council. Moneys from the	
11	special revolving fund shall be expended only to hire personnel	
12	to administer the reduced ignition propensity cigarette program	
13	and to cover any costs associated with the program, including	
14	processing, testing, enforcement, inspections, and oversight.	
15	The state fire council is authorized to annually adjust this fee	
16	to ensure it defrays the actual costs of the administration,	
17	processing, testing, enforcement, <i>inspection,</i> and oversight	
18	activities required by this chapter.	
19	The certifications shall be made available to the attorney	
20	general for purposes consistent with this chapter."	
21	SECTION 2. Section 132C-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
22	amended to read as follows:	
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1	"[ <del>[</del> ]§132C-8[ <del>]</del> ] Existing inventories; consumer t	cesting.
2	The requirement that cigarettes sold in Hawaii must k	be in
3	compliance with this chapter shall not prohibit:	
4	(1) Wholesalers or dealers from selling existing	ng cigarette
5	inventories on or after September 30, [ <del>2009</del>	<del>);</del> ] <u>2010;</u>
6	provided that the wholesaler or dealer can	establish
7	both of the following to the satisfaction of	of the state
8	fire council:	
9	(A) The Hawaii tax stamps were affixed to	the
10	cigarettes pursuant to chapter 245 pri	or to
11	September 30, [ <del>2009;</del> ] <u>2010;</u> and	
12	(B) The inventory was purchased prior to S	September
13	30, [ <del>2009,</del> ] <u>2010,</u> and the purchased in	nventory is
14	comparable to the amount of inventory	purchased
15	during the same period the previous ye	ear; or
16	(2) The sale of cigarettes solely for the purpo	ose of
17	consumer testing. For the purposes of this	s paragraph,
18	the term "consumer testing" means an assess	sment of
19	cigarettes that is conducted by or under th	ne control
20	and direction of a manufacturer for the pur	rpose of
21	evaluating consumer acceptance of cigarette	es, using
22	only the quantity of cigarettes that is rea	asonably
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1	necessary for the assessment, and in a controlled
2	setting where the cigarettes are either consumed on-
3	site or returned to the testing administrators at the
4	conclusion of the testing."
5	SECTION 3. Act 218, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, is
6	amended by amending section 6 to read as follows:
7	"SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on September 30,
8	$[\frac{2009}{7}]$ 2010, and shall be implemented to coincide with the
9	excise tax incremental increase on cigarettes effective
10	September 30, [ <del>2009,</del> ] <u>2010,</u> pursuant to section 245-3, Hawaii
11	Revised Statutes; provided that section 4 shall take effect upon
12	approval of this Act; provided further that section $[5(1),-5(1)]$
13	132C-5(1), Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall take effect upon
14	approval of this Act."
15	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

#### Report Title:

Reduced Ignition Propensity Cigarettes; Certification; Revolving Fund

#### Description:

Delays implementation of the reduced ignition propensity cigarettes law to 09/30/2010. Creates a special revolving fund to receive deposits of cigarette certification fees. Authorizes the state fire council to expend moneys from the fund to cover the reduced ignition propensity cigarettes personnel and program costs. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)
