### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEMPORARY HEALTH INSURANCE FOR UNEMPLOYED PERSONS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. A number of Hawaii-based companies have closed
or filed for bankruptcy in 2008, resulting in layoffs and
furloughs. Employees of large, well-established companies
including airlines, cruise lines, agricultural companies, and
retailers, as well as small businesses, have been drastically
affected by the economic downturn.

7 In December 2008, the state reached a nine-year high 8 unemployment rate of 4.9 per cent. Over 32,000 individuals were 9 unemployed in November 2008, an increase of over 2,000 from the 10 previous month. By comparison, only 18,850 were reportedly 11 unemployed in late 2007.

12 The downturn in nearly every private-sector industry has 13 caused significant numbers of Hawaii residents to be victims of 14 employment furloughs, layoffs, reduced work hours, and 15 terminations. While these individuals may obtain some financial 16 relief through employment insurance benefits, they may not be 17 able to continue their health care insurance coverage.

1 The purpose of this Act is to help unemployed individuals maintain health care coverage by providing a temporary health 2 3 insurance program. 4 There is established the temporary health SECTION 2. (a) insurance for unemployed persons program within the department 5 of human services to provide temporary health coverage for 6 7 persons who have become unemployed on or after March 31, 2008. 8 (b) To be eligible to participate in this program, the 9 individual shall: 10 Have lost the person's health insurance as a result of (1)11 a furlough, a layoff, reduced work hours, or 12 termination of employment on or after March 31, 2008; 13 (2)Not be eligible for any health insurance coverage from 14 another source; and 15 (3)Agree to pay for the costs of the individual's 16 coverage premium. 17 (C) This program shall have a benefit package similar to 18 the basic benefits provided by the department of human services' 19 QUEST-Net program and shall be administered by the department of 20 human services. 21 SECTION 3. (a) If an individual is entitled to continue 22 health insurance coverage pursuant to the Consolidated Omnibus

1 Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA), the individual may apply for 2 reimbursement of payments made for the purpose of continuing the 3 individual's health insurance medical and prescription drug 4 coverage up to the following monthly amounts: 5 Single: \$125.00 6 Family: \$315.00 7 The total reimbursement an individual may collect (b) 8 under this section shall be for three months of coverage from 9 the effective date of the individual's loss of coverage. (c) An individual is eligible for reimbursement of 10 11 payments if: 12 (1)The person became unemployed, was furloughed, or suffered a reduction of work hours which has resulted 13 14 in the loss of the person's employment-related group health insurance which occurred on or after March 31, 15 16 2008, and is ineligible for any other insurance 17 through the individual's spouse or parents; The person is entitled to continue health insurance 18 (2)19 coverage pursuant to the Consolidated Omnibus Budget 20 Reconciliation Act (COBRA); The individual is not eligible for any other 21 (3)

1 or subsidy aimed to assist the unemployed person in 2 continuing the individual's group health insurance 3 coverage; 4 (4) The individual discloses and certifies in writing the 5 amount paid by the individual for prescription and 6 medical coverage for the three-month period beginning on the effective date of the individual's loss of 7 8 coverage; and 9 (5) The individual's employer certifies in writing that 10 the individual is not entitled to any other subsidy 11 offered by the employer or the employer's health 12 insurer. 13 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,587,600 or so much 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and the 16 sum of \$1,360,800 or so much thereof as may be necessary for 17 fiscal year 2010-2011 to administer the temporary health 18 insurance for unemployed persons program established under this 19 Act.

20 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department21 of human services for the purposes of this Act.



SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much
thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 for the
reimbursement of payments for persons entitled to continue
health insurance coverage pursuant to the Consolidated Omnibus
Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA) made under this Act.

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of8 labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this Act.

9 SECTION 6: This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009, and10 shall be repealed on June 30, 2010.
