#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL LICENSING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to require certain 2 licensing entities in the department of commerce and consumer 3 affairs to accept certification of an applicant's skill level by 4 any branch of the United States armed forces as proof that the 5 applicant has satisfied the educational or experience 6 requirements to be eligible to take the examination for 7 licensure, if an examination exists, in specific professions and 8 vocations, provided that the licensing entity deems that the 9 skill level certified by the military meets or exceeds the 10 requirements of the State. This Act specifically applies to 11 motor vehicle mechanics, barbers, dental hygienists, dentists, 12 electricians, plumbers, physicians and osteopathic physicians, 13 registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, advanced practice 14 registered nurses, and private guards.

15 SECTION 2. Section 437B-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

17 "(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) [below], every 18 mechanic applying for [+]licensure[+] shall have passed the HB LRB 09-1247.doc

7	United States armed forces meets or exceeds the requirements of
8	the State."
9	SECTION 3. Section 438-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

12	(1) Be at least seventeen years of age;
13	(2) Have a total of fifteen hundred clock hours of barber
14	training through the following or a combination

18	(B) As a student enrolled in a school that has a
19	barbering curriculum; provided that only classes
20	related to barbering shall be applied towards the
21	accumulation of clock hours[+]; or



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1		(C) Through certification of the applicant's skill
2		level by any branch of the United States armed
3		forces; provided that the board deems that the
4		substance of the certified skill level meets or
5		exceeds the requirements of the State;
6		the board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to
7		implement this paragraph; and
8	(3)	Take and pass an examination for licensure."
9	SECT	ION 4. Section 447-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

17		course, recognized by the board of dental examiners;
18		or holding certification of the applicant's skill
19		level by any branch of the United States armed forces;
20		provided that the board deems that the substance of
21		the certified skill level meets or exceeds the
22		requirements of the State; and

2		of intra-oral infiltration local anesthesia and		
3	-	intra-oral block anesthesia by an accredited dental

(a) An applicant shall 8 possess the following minimum qualifications: 9 Journey worker electrician. Every applicant to be (1)10 eligible for the journey worker electrician examination shall be at least eighteen years of age 11 12 and shall provide satisfactory evidence of experience 13 in residential or commercial wiring of at least five 14 years full-time or its equivalent, but not less than 10,000 hours of experience in the trade under the 15 supervision of a journey worker or supervising 16 17 electrician. Journey worker specialty electrician. Every applicant 18 (2) 19 to be eligible for the journey worker specialty 20 electrician examination shall be at least eighteen 21 years of age and shall have had at least five years' 22 experience in the trade.

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(3) Supervising electrician. Every applicant to be
 eligible for the supervising electrician examination
 shall have been registered with the board as a journey
 worker electrician for at least a period of four years
 in the trade or shall have had equivalent experience
 in the trade.

7 (4) Supervising specialty electrician. Every applicant to
8 be eligible for the supervising specialty electrician

11 a period of four years in the trade or shall have had
12 equivalent experience in the trade.

(5) Journey worker plumber. Every applicant to be
eligible for the journey worker plumber examination
shall have had experience of at least five years'
full-time or its equivalent but not less than 10,000
hours as a journey worker's or master plumber's
helper, and is able to furnish satisfactory evidence
of such fact.

20 (6) Master plumber. Every applicant to be eligible for
21 the master plumber examination shall have been
22 registered with the board as a journey worker plumber

3	(7)	Maintenance electrician. Every applicant to be
4		eligible for the maintenance electrician examination
5		shall be not less than eighteen years of age and shall
6		have had at least one year of experience in performing
7		electrical maintenance work or proof of two years of
8		schooling in the electrical trade.
9	(8)	Journey worker industrial electrician. Every
10		applicant to be eligible for the journey worker
11		industrial electrician examination shall be at least
12		eighteen years of age and shall have had experience in
13		industrial electrical work of at least five years
14		full-time or its equivalent, but not less than 10,000
15		hours.
16	(9)	Supervising industrial electrician. Every applicant
17		to be eligible for the supervising industrial
18		electrician examination shall have been registered
19		with the board as a journey worker industrial
20		electrician for a period of at least four years or
21		shall have had equivalent experience in the trade.

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1	(b) For the experience requirements in subsection (a), the
2	board shall accept certification of the applicant's skill level
3	by any branch of the United States armed forces as proof in
4	satisfaction of any or all of the experience requirements in
5	order for the applicant to be eligible for the examination;
6	provided that the board deems that the substance of the
7	certified skill level meets or exceeds the requirements of the
8	State."
9	SECTION 7. Section 453-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
11	"(b) Before any applicant shall be eligible for licensure,
12	the applicant shall furnish proof satisfactory to the board
13	that:
14	(1) The applicant is of demonstrated competence and
15	professional knowledge; and either:

17	(A) A medical school or college whose program leading
18	to the M.D. degree is accredited by the Liaison
19	Committee on Medical Education or whose program

Applicants shall be eligible to apply for a 8 license by examination if they have: 9 (1) Graduated from a registered nursing program at an 10 educational institution in the United States or any 11 territory or possession under the jurisdiction of the 12 United States and are qualified as determined by the 13 board through rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91; 14 (2)Graduated from a registered nursing program at an 15 educational institution in a foreign jurisdiction and 16 have had their transcripts evaluated by professional 17 evaluators designated by the board and are considered 18 qualified as determined by the board through rules 19 adopted pursuant to chapter 91; [or] 20 (3)Graduated with a bachelor's degree and satisfactorily 21 completed the pre-licensure portion of a master's 22 entry program in nursing at an accredited school of



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1		nursing in the United States or any territory or
2		possession under the jurisdiction of the United States
3		that is recognized by the board or other state boards

12	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

15	prescribe	d by the board and shall provide written evidence that
16	the appli	cant has completed a licensed practical nurse program,
17	or its eq	uivalent, approved by the board, and holds a diploma or
18	certifica	te therefrom. The board shall deem certification of an
19	applicant	's skill level by any branch of the United States armed
20	forces as	the equivalent of a licensed practical nurse program;
21	provided	that the board deems that the substance of certified
22	skill lev	el meets or exceeds the requirements of the State."

10	(3)	An unencumbered recognition as an advanced practice		
11		registered nurse or similar designation in all other		
12		states in which the nurse has a current and active		
13		recognition as an advanced practice registered nurse;		
14	(4)	A master's degree in nursing as specified in rules		
15		adopted by the board or a current certification for		
16		specialized and advanced nursing practice from either		
17		a national certifying body recognized by the board[ $ au$ ]		
18		or any branch of the United States armed forces,		
19		provided that the board deems that the substance of		
20		the skill level certified by the branch of the United		
21		States armed forces meets or exceeds the requirements

8	making wr	itten application therefor. The applicant, if an
9	individua	l, or the principal guard of a firm shall:
10	(1)	Be not less than eighteen years of age;
11	(2)	Have had a high school education or its equivalent;
12	(3)	Have had experience reasonably equivalent to at least
13		four years of full-time guard work[+], including
14		certification of an applicant's skill level by any
15		branch of the United States armed forces; provided
16		that the board deems that the substance of certified
17		skill level meets or exceeds the experience
18		requirements of the State;
19	(4)	Not be presently suffering from any psychiatric or
20		psychological disorder which is directly related and
21		detrimental to a person's performance in the
22		profession;



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1 (5) Not have been convicted in any jurisdiction of a crime 2 which reflects unfavorably on the fitness of the 3 applicant to engage in the profession, unless the 4 conviction has been annulled or expunged by court 5 order; and

6 (6) Possess a history of honesty, truthfulness, financial
7 integrity, and fair dealing.

8 A firm applying for a guard agency license shall have in its 9 employ an individual who is licensed as a guard and who shall be 10 designated as the principal guard for the firm, and shall 11 provide a bond as required under section 463-12."

SECTION 12. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketedand stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
