A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRUELTY TO ANIMALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 711, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§711- Cruelty to animals by fighting dogs in the second
5	degree. (1) A person commits the offense of cruelty to animals
6	by fighting dogs in the second degree if the person:
7	(a) Knowingly wagers or pays to attend a dogfight; or
8	(b) Knowingly possesses any device intended to enhance the
9	dog's fighting ability with the intent that the device
10	be used to train or prepare the dog for a dogfight.
11	As used in this section:
12	"Device" means both animate and inanimate objects and
13	includes live animals used as bait animals.
14	"Dogfight" means a dog or dogs pitted against another dog
15	or dogs with the intent that the encounter will result in injury
16	to one or more of the dogs.
17	"Wager" means staking or risking something of value on the

1	(2) Violation of this section shall be a misdemeanor."		
2	SECTION 2. Section 711-1109.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
3	amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows:		
4	"(1) If there is probable cause to believe that a pet		
5	animal is being subjected to treatment in violation of section		
6	711-1108.5, 711-1109, 711-1109.3, [or] 711-1109.6, <u>or</u>		
7	711- , a law enforcement officer, after obtaining a search		
8	warrant or in any other manner authorized by law, may enter the		
9	premises where the pet animal is located to provide the pet		
10	animal with food, water, and emergency medical treatment or to		
11	impound the pet animal. If after reasonable effort, the owner		
12	or person having custody of the pet animal cannot be found and		
13	notified of the impoundment, an impoundment notice shall be		
14	conspicuously posted on the premises and within seventy-two		
15	hours after posting, the notice shall be sent by certified mail		
16	to the address, if any, from which the pet animal was removed."		
17	SECTION 3. Section 711-1109.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
18	amended as follows:		
19	1. By amending subsection (1) to read:		
20	"(1) If any pet animal is impounded pursuant to section		
21	711-1109.1, prior to final disposition of the criminal charge		
22	under section 711-1108.5, 711-1109, 711-1109.3, [or] 711-1109.6,

1 or 711- , against the pet animal's owner, any duly 2 incorporated humane society or duly incorporated society for the 3 prevention of cruelty to animals that is holding the pet animal 4 may file a petition in the criminal action requesting that the 5 court issue an order for forfeiture of the pet animal to the 6 county or to the duly incorporated humane society or duly 7 incorporated society for the prevention of cruelty to animals 8 prior to final disposition of the criminal charge. The 9 petitioner shall serve a true copy of the petition upon the 10 defendant and the prosecuting attorney."

12 "(3) At a hearing conducted pursuant to subsection (2), 13 the petitioner shall have the burden of establishing probable 14 cause that the pet animal was subjected to a violation of 15 section 711-1108.5, 711-1109, 711-1109.3, [or] 711-1109.6[-], or 16 711- . If the court finds that probable cause exists, the 17 court shall order immediate forfeiture of the pet animal to the 18 petitioner, unless the defendant, within seventy-two hours of 19 the hearing:

16	SECT	ION 4. Section 711-1109.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended t	o read as follows:
18	"§71	1-1109.3 Cruelty to animals[+] by fighting dogs in the
19	first deg	ree. (1) A person commits the offense of cruelty to
20	animals <u>b</u>	y fighting dogs in the first degree if the person:

1	[(a)	Owns or trains any dog with the intent that such dog
2		shall be engaged in an exhibition of fighting with
3		another dog;
4	(d)	For amusement or gain, intentionally causes any dog to
5		fight with another dog, or causes any dog to injure
6		another dog; or
7	(c)	Knowingly or recklessly permits any act in violation
8		of paragraph (a) or (b) to be done on the premises
9		under the person's charge or control, or aids or abets
10		any such act.]
11	<u>(a)</u>	For entertainment or financial gain knowingly causes,
12		sponsors, arranges, or holds a dogfight;
13	(b)	Knowingly owns, trains, transports, possesses,
14		breeds, sells, transfers, or equips any dog with the
15		intent that the dog shall be engaged in a dogfight;
16	(c)	Knowingly or recklessly allows a dogfight to occur on
17		any property owned or controlled by the person; or
18	(d)	Knowingly or recklessly allows any dog intended to be
19		used for a dogfight to be kept, trained on, or
20		transported in, any property owned or controlled by
21		the person.

1 Nothing in this section shall prohibit any of the (2)2 following: 3 The use of dogs in the management of livestock by the (a) 4 owner of the livestock or the owner's employees or 5 agents or other persons in lawful custody thereof; 6 (b) The use of dogs in hunting wildlife including game; or 7 The training of dogs or the use of equipment in the (C) 8 training of dogs for any purpose not prohibited by 9 law. 10 (3) As used in this section, "dogfight" means a dog or 11 dogs pitted against another dog or dogs with the intent that the 12 encounter will result in injury to one or more of the dogs. 13 [(3)] (4) Violation of this section shall be a class C 14 felony. [-(4)] (5) If there is any conflict between this section 15 16 and section 711-1109, or any other provision of law, this 17 section shall apply." 18 SECTION 5. Section 711-1110.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended as follows: 19 20 "§711-1110.5 Surrender or forfeiture of animals. Upon 21 conviction, quilty plea, or plea of nolo contendere for any

1	SECTION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
2	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
3	begun, before its effective date.
4	SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
7	provided that the amendments made to section 711-1109.1, Hawaii
8	Revised Statutes, in section 2 of this Act, and to section
9	711-1109.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, in section 3 of this Act
10	shall not be repealed when those sections are reenacted on
11	July 1, 2011 pursuant to Act 128, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008.
