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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WHISTLEBLOWERS' PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that public employees may 2 possess information about improper activities such as waste, 3 fraud, and misconduct occurring in state and local government, but may not report the information because of fear of 4 5 retaliation by their supervisors. Greater protection for public 6 employees is necessary to encourage them to come forward with 7 information that will help ensure the efficiency and integrity 8 of state and local government. 9 The purpose of this Act is to provide additional protection 10 to public employees who report violations of the law, and other 11 improper activities such as economic waste, gross misconduct, 12 incompetence, or inefficiency. SECTION 2. Part V of chapter 378, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 13 14 is amended by designating sections 378-61 to 378-69, Hawaii 15 Revised Statutes, as subpart A and adding a title before section 16 378-61, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to read as follows:

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"A. General Provisions"

14	permit the	e public employee to readily observe a copy on the way
15	to or from	n the public employee's place of employment.
16	(d)	For purposes of this section:
17	"Pub	lic employee" means any employee of the State or any
18	county, o:	r the political subdivision and agencies of the State
19	or any co	unty, any employee under contract with the State or any
20	county, a	ny civil service employee, and any probationary or
21	provisiona	al employee of the State or county.

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1	"Public employer" means the State and any county, and the		
2	political subdivisions and agencies of the State and any county,		
3	and includes any agent thereof."		
4	SECTION 4. Chapter 78, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended		
5	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to		
6	read as follows:		
7	"§78- Whistleblowers. (a) Upon receipt of any		
8	complaint made pursuant to section 378- , the ombudsman shall		
9	inform the complainant of the complainant's rights under the		
10	law.		
11	(b) The ombudsman shall prescribe notices pertaining to		
12	the application of part V of chapter 378."		
13	SECTION 5. Section 96-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
14	amended to read as follows:		
15	"§96-8 Appropriate subjects for investigation. (a) An		
16	appropriate subject for investigation is an administrative act		
17	of an agency [which] <u>that</u> might be:		
18	(1) Contrary to law;		
19	(2) Unreasonable, unfair, oppressive, or unnecessarily		
20	discriminatory, even though in accordance with law;		
21	(3) Based on a mistake of fact;		
22	(4) Based on improper or irrelevant grounds;		

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1	(5)	Unaccompanied by an adequate statement of reasons;
2	(6)	Performed in an inefficient manner; [or]
3	(7)	A violation of section 378- ; or
4	[(7)]	(8) Otherwise erroneous.
5	(b)	The ombudsman may investigate to find an appropriate
6	remedy."

9	SECT	ION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
