A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILDREN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I			
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that over thirty per cent			
3	of children in foster care, or approximately one thousand			
4	children, are of Hawaiian ancestry and native Hawaiian			
5	5 communities and families have expressed concern that cultural			
6	needs are not considered as heavily as they should be in the			
7	placement of foster children.			
8	Additionally, the federal child and family services review			
9	of Hawaii's child welfare system recommends the use of			
10	culturally sensitive and family strengthening diversion and			
11	other supportive services to improve the safety and well-being			
12	of children and families.			
13	The purpose of this Act is to comply with the federal child			
14	and family services review's recommendations by clarifying that			
15	local customs of caring for children outside of the family home			
16	by relatives and friends and other diversion and supportive			
17	services are, where appropriate, available alternatives to the			
18	department of human services and the court assuming custody of

- 1 children. This will ensure that no child is taken into custody
- 2 unnecessarily and will preserve the relationships that are
- 3 important to every child's well being.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 587-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately
- 6 inserted and to read as follows:
- 7 ""Caregiver" means an adult who is not the child's legal
- 8 and physical custodian but with whom a child has been residing
- 9 for at least six months with the verbal or written consent of
- 10 the child's legal and physical custodian. A "caregiver" is
- 11 outside the formal child welfare system, and shall not apply to
- 12 situations involving voluntary placement or court order.
- "Safe home" means a home, other than the family home, where
- 14 a child has resided with the consent of the child's legal and
- 15 physical custodian, and where a caregiver has demonstrated a
- 16 willingness and ability to provide a home where the child is not
- 17 subject to harm or threatened harm, as determined by the
- 18 department. A "safe home" is outside the formal child welfare
- 19 system, and shall not apply to situations involving voluntary
- 20 placement or court order."
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 587-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 22 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

1	(d) "	Upon satisfying itself as to the course of action
2	that shou	ld be pursued to best accord with the purpose of this
3	chapter,	the department shall:
4	(1)	Close the matter if the department finds, after an
5		assessment, that the child is residing with an
6		appropriate caregiver who is willing and able to
7		provide a safe home for the child;
8	[(1)]	(2) Resolve the matter in an informal fashion
9		appropriate under the circumstances;
10	[(2)]	(3) Seek to enter into a service plan, without filing
11		a petition in court, with members of the child's
12		family and other authorized agency as the department
13		deems necessary to the success of the service plan,
14		including the member or members of the child's family
15		who have legal custody of the child. The service plan
16		may include an agreement with the child's family to
17		voluntarily place the child in the foster custody of
18		the department or other authorized agency $[\tau]$; provided
19		that placement preference shall be given to an
20		appropriate relative identified by the department, or
21		to place the child and the necessary members of the
22		child's family under the family supervision of the

1		department or other authorized agency; provided
2		further that if a service plan is not successfully
3		completed within six months, the department shall file
4		a petition or ensure that a petition is filed by
5		another appropriate authorized agency in court under
6		this chapter and the case shall be reviewed as is
7		required by federal law;
8	[-(3) -]	(4) Assume temporary foster custody of the child
9		pursuant to section 587-24(a) and file a petition with
10		the court under this chapter within three working
11		days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays,
12		after the date of the department's assumption of
13		temporary foster custody of the child; provided that
14		placement preference shall be given to an appropriate
15		relative identified by the department; or
16	[(4)]	(5) File a petition or [ensure that a petition is
17		filed by] refer the matter to another appropriate
18		authorized agency who may file a petition for
19		jurisdiction of the child in court under this
20		chapter."
21	SECT	ION 4. Section 587-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
22	amended by	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

1	"(a)	A police officer shall assume protective custody of		
2	the child	without a court order and without the consent of the		
3	child's family regardless of whether the child's family is			
4	absent, if in the discretion of the police officer, the child is			
5	in such circumstance or condition that the child's continuing in			
6	the custody or care of the child's family presents a situation			
7	of imminent harm to the child.			
8	A police officer may assume protective custody of the child			
9	without a court order and without the consent of the child's			
10	family regardless of whether the child's family is absent, if in			
11	the discretion of the police officer:			
12	(1)	The child has no legal custodian or appropriate		
13		caregiver who is willing and able to provide a safe		
14		family home for the child; or		
15	(2)	There is evidence that the parent or legal guardian of		
16		the child has subjected the child to harm or		
17		threatened harm and that the parent or legal guardian		
18		is likely to flee the jurisdiction of the court with		
19		the child."

SECTION 5. The legislature finds that the Hawaiian culture has long embraced the traditional system of "hanai" which allows HB798 HD1 HMS 2009-2286

- 1 a person other than a child's parent to play a substantial role
- 2 in the material support and upbringing of the child. In many
- 3 cases, the people raising children of Hawaiian ancestry in a
- 4 hanai relationship are the children's grandparents. However,
- 5 due to age and economic circumstances, many caregivers in a
- 6 hanai relationship are unable to satisfy the department of human
- 7 services' requirements for the licensing of foster parents,
- 8 resulting in children being taken into the department's custody.
- 9 SECTION 6. Section 346-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 11 "(d) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
- 12 91 relating to:
- 13 (1) Standards for the organization and administration of
- 14 child placing organizations;
- 15 (2) Standards of conditions, management, and competence
- 16 for the care and training of minor children in child
- 17 caring institutions and foster boarding homes; and
- 18 (3) Standards of conditions and competence of operation of
- 19 foster boarding homes as may be necessary to protect
- the welfare of children [-];
- 21 provided that all rules of the department regarding the
- 22 licensing process for foster parents or the certification

- 1 process of foster family boarding homes may consider the
- 2 recognition and respect of the Hawaiian culture and of hanai
- 3 relationships."
- 4 SECTION 7. The department of human services shall submit a
- 5 report to the legislature of its findings and recommendations,
- 6 rules to be adopted, and if necessary, proposed legislation, no
- 7 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
- 8 session of 2010.
- 9 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Child Welfare Services; Foster Care; Hanai

Description:

Allows rules adopted by the department of human services for the foster care licensing process to include recognition of and respect for Hawaiian culture and hanai relationships. Adds definitions for "caregiver" and "safe home" to the Child Protective Act. Clarifies that hanai relationships are available alternatives for child custody. (HB798 HD1)
