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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE FEDERAL VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that one of the goals of
 the federal Violence Against Women Act is to protect women who
 are victims of domestic violence or sexual assault, including
 undocumented immigrants, from their perpetrators.

The United States Department of Justice, through the Office 5 on Violence Against Women, encourages nonprofits, community-6 7 based organizations, and other social service organizations to 8 aid victims of violence by providing legal and social services 9 to enable women to report abuse and cooperate with law 10 enforcement without fear of being legally reprimanded due to 11 their immigration status. The Violence Against Women Act 12 created special rules for undocumented immigrants who are victims of domestic violence or sexual assault to allow them to 13 14 apply for a work permit and a U-visa, which provides immigration 15 status to noncitizens willing to assist authorities in 16 investigating crimes.

However, despite the provisions of the Violence Against
Women Act, many domestic violence or sexual assault victims do HB872 HD1 HMS 2009-1705

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not report perpetrators or help to prosecute them because of fear of deportation. Also, many victims are unfamiliar with the laws that protect them and their children. Additionally, women who have cooperated with authorities have been unable to financially support their families because of a lack of job experience, job training, and interviewing skills.

7 The purpose of this Act is to request that the department 8 of human services establish a pilot project to enable community-9 based organizations to provide legal advice and social services 10 to victims of domestic violence or sexual assault who are 11 undocumented immigrants, in accordance with the goals of the 12 federal Violence Against Women Act.

SECTION 2. (a) The department of human services may establish a pilot project to assist undocumented immigrants who are victims of domestic violence or sexual assault, including assistance qualifying for protection under the federal Violence Against Women Act.

18 (b) If established, the pilot project shall provide the 19 following services to undocumented immigrants who are victims of 20 domestic violence or sexual assault:

21 (1) Assistance with restraining orders;

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1	(2)	Assistance with applications for petitions under the
2		federal Violence Against Women Act, U-visas, and work
3		permits;
4	(3)	Workshops on building self-esteem and self-confidence;
5	(4)	Instruction on appropriate workplace etiquette and
6		appearance;
7	(5)	Training in effective job search techniques;
8	(6)	Career assessments, when appropriate, to identify
9		marketable skills and assess employability;
10	(7)	Information about current labor market trends for
11		employment and training;
12	(8)	Placement with employers who agree to hire a
13		prearranged number of victims;
14	(9)	Post-employment services;
15	(10)	Legal assistance with divorces, child custody and
16		support, housing and consumer issues, and other family
17		law issues; and
18	(11)	Case management needs, including language learning,
19		and information and assistance using public
20		transportation, obtaining identification, and other
21		skills as necessary.



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(c) If the pilot project is established, the department of
 human services shall submit a report to the legislature no later
 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
 of 2011, including the number of victims who received services
 and the types of assistance they received.

6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval7 and shall be repealed on June 30, 2011.
