A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MAKUA.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by adding a 2 new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read as 3 follows: 4 "CHAPTER 5 MAKUA VALLEY RESERVE 6 § -1 Administration of chapter. The Makua valley 7 reserve commission and the department of land and natural resources shall administer this chapter. 8 9 § -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the 10 context otherwise requires: 11 "Commission" means the Makua valley reserve commission. "Department" means the department of land and natural 12 13 resources. 14 "Valley reserve" means the area designated on the island of 15 Oahu as Makua valley, including the three ahupua'a of 16 Kahanahaiki, Makua, and Koi`ahi. 17 The Makua valley reserve -3 Reservation of uses. (a)

shall be used solely and exclusively for the following purposes:

1	(1)	Preservation and practice of all rights customarily
2		and traditionally exercised by native Hawaiians for
3		cultural, spiritual, and subsistence purposes;
4	(2)	Preservation and protection of its archaeological,
5		historical, and environmental resources;
6	(3)	Rehabilitation, revegetation, habitat restoration, and
7		preservation; and
8	(4)	Education.
9	(b)	The Makua valley shall be reserved in perpetuity for
10	the uses	enumerated in subsection (a). Commercial uses shall be
11	strictly	prohibited.
12	\$	-4 Powers and duties. The department and other
13	departmen	ts and agencies of the State shall be subject to the
14	oversight	of the commission with regard to the control and
15	managemen	t of the valley reserve. Subject to section -6, the
16	departmen	t shall:
17	(1)	Implement controls and permitted uses for the valley
18		reserve;
19	(2)	Enforce this chapter;
20	(3)	Provide administrative support to the commission; and
21	(4)	Authorize those of its employees as it deems
22		reasonable and necessary to serve and execute warrants

1		and arrest offenders or issue citations in all matters
2		relating to enforcement of the laws and rules
3		applicable to the valley reserve.
4	\$	-5 Commission. (a) There is established the Makua
5	valley re	serve commission to be placed within the department of
6	land and	natural resources for administrative purposes as
7	provided	in section 26-35. The commission shall consist of ten
8	members t	o be appointed in the manner and to serve for the terms
9	provided	in section 26-34; provided that:
10	(1)	One member shall be a member of Malama Makua;
11	(2)	One member shall be a member of Hui Malama O Makua;
12	(3)	One member shall be a member of Koa Mana;
13	(4)	One member shall be a representative of families that
14		were evicted from Makua valley or whose lands in Makua
15		valley were condemned by the federal government;
16	(5)	One member shall be appointed by the governor from a
17		list provided by the Waianae coast community;
18	(6)	One member shall be a trustee or representative of the
19		office of Hawaiian affairs;
20	(7)	One member shall be the commanding officer of the
21		United States Army in the Pacific, or the commanding
22		officer's designee;

- (8) One member shall be the adjutant general of the State
 of Hawaii, or the adjutant general's designee;
- 3 (9) One member shall be the chairperson of the board of4 land and natural resources; and
- (10) One member shall be appointed by the governor from alist provided by native Hawaiian organizations.
- 7 (b) The governor shall appoint the chairperson from among 8 the members of the commission.
- 9 (c) The members of the commission shall serve without pay
 10 but shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses,
 11 including travel expenses, incurred in carrying out their
- (d) Any action taken by the commission shall be approved
 by a simple majority of its members. Six members shall
 constitute a quorum to do business.
- (e) The commission, without regard to the requirements of chapter 76, may hire employees necessary to perform its duties.
- § -6 Responsibilities and duties of the commission. The general administration of the valley reserve shall rest with the commission. In carrying out its duties and responsibilities,

1	(1)	Shall establish criteria, policies, and controls for
2		permissible uses within the valley reserve;
3	(2)	Shall approve all contracts for services and rules
4		pertaining to the valley reserve;
5	(3)	Shall provide advice to the governor, the department,
6		and other departments and agencies on any matter
7		relating to the valley reserve;
8	(4)	Shall provide advice to the office of planning and the
9		attorney general on any matter relating to the federal
10		conveyance of Makua valley;
11	(5)	May enter into curatorship or stewardship agreements
12		with appropriate Hawaiian cultural and spiritual
13		community organizations for the perpetuation of native
14		Hawaiian cultural, religious, and subsistence customs,
15		beliefs, and practices for the purposes stated in
16		section -3;
17	(6)	Shall carry out those powers and duties concerning the
18		valley reserve otherwise conferred upon the city and
19		county of Honolulu by chapter 205A. The powers and
20		duties of the city and county of Honolulu and its

agencies concerning coastal zone dispositions and

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1		approvals pertaining to the valley reserve are
2		transferred to the commission;
3	(7)	Shall adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 that
4		are necessary for the purposes of this chapter and
5		shall maintain a record of its proceedings and
6		actions; and
7	(8)	May delegate to the executive director or employees of
8		the commission, by formal commission action, such
9		power and authority vested in the commission by this
10		chapter as the commission deems reasonable and proper
11		for the effective administration of this chapter.
12	\$	-7 Interim activities of the commission. Prior to the
13	return of	Makua valley from the United States Army to the State,
14	the commi	ssion may enter into discussions with the Army to
15	facilitat	e the expedient return of Makua valley upon the
16	expiration	n of the Army's lease.
17	\$	-8 Penalty. Any person who violates any of the laws
18	or rules	applicable to the valley reserve shall be guilty of a
19	petty mis	demeanor and shall be fined not more than \$1,000 or
20	imprisone	d not more than thirty days, or both, for each offense.
21	Each day	of each violation shall be deemed a separate offense.

1	§ -	9 General administrative penalties. (a) Except as
2	otherwise	provided by law, the commission may set, charge, and
3	collect a	dministrative fines, or bring legal action to recover
4	administr	ative costs of the commission or the department, or
5	payment f	or damages, or for the cost to correct damages
6	resulting	from a violation of this chapter or any rule adopted
7	thereunde	r. The administrative fines shall be as follows:
8	(1)	For a first violation, by a fine of not more than
9		\$10,000;
10	(2)	For a second violation within five years of a previous
11		violation, by a fine of not more than \$15,000; and
12	(3)	For a third or subsequent violation within five years
13		of the last violation, by a fine of not more than
14		\$25,000.
15	(b)	In addition, an administrative fine of up to \$5,000
16	may be le	vied for each specimen of natural resource or any
17	historic	property taken, killed, injured, broken, or damaged in
18	violation	of any rule adopted under this chapter. For purposes
19	of this s	ection, "natural resource" includes any archaeological
20	artifacts	, minerals, any aquatic or terrestrial life or wildlife
21	or parts	thereof, including their eggs, and any land plants or
22	parts the	reof, including seeds. For purposes of this section,
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- 1 "historic property" means any building, structure, object,
- 2 districts, area, or site, including heiau and underwater site
- 3 that is over fifty years old.
- 4 (c) Any criminal penalty for any violation of this chapter
- 5 or any rule adopted under this chapter shall not be deemed to
- 6 preclude the commission from bringing a civil legal action to
- 7 recover additional administrative fines and costs. Any civil
- 8 legal action against a person to recover administrative fines
- 9 and costs for any violation of this chapter or any rule adopted
- 10 under this chapter shall not be deemed to preclude the State
- 11 from pursuing any criminal action against that person.
- (d) In any judicial proceeding to recover an
- 13 administrative penalty imposed, the commission need only show
- **14** that:
- 15 (1) Notice was given;
- 16 (2) A hearing was held or the time granted for requesting
- a hearing has run without a request for a hearing;
- 18 (3) An administrative penalty was imposed; and
- 19 (4) The administrative penalty remains unpaid.
- 20 § -10 Transfer. Upon its return to the State, the
- 21 resources of Makua valley shall be held in trust as part of the
- 22 public land trust; provided that the State shall transfer

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- 1 management and control of the valley to the sovereign native
- 2 Hawaiian entity upon its recognition by the United States and
- 3 the State of Hawaii.
- 4 All terms, conditions, agreements, and laws affecting Makua
- 5 valley, including any ongoing obligations relating to the clean-
- 6 up of the valley, shall remain in effect unless expressly
- 7 terminated.
- 9 There is created in the state treasury a trust fund to be
- 10 designated as the Makua valley rehabilitation trust fund to be
- 11 administered by the department with the prior approval of the
- 12 commission. Subject to this chapter:
- 13 (1) All moneys received from the federal government for
- 14 the rehabilitation and environmental restoration of
- Makua valley;
- 16 (2) Any moneys appropriated by the legislature to the
- 17 trust fund;
- 18 (3) Any proceeds from administrative fines imposed and
- 19 collected under this chapter; and
- 20 (4) The interest or return on investments earned from
- 21 moneys in the trust fund,



- 1 shall be deposited in the trust fund and shall be used to
- 2 fulfill the purposes of this chapter.
- 3 (b) The commission may use moneys in the trust fund to
- 4 carry out the purposes of this chapter, including hiring
- 5 employees, specialists, and consultants necessary to complete
- 6 projects related to the purposes of this chapter.
- 7 (c) Moneys deposited into or appropriated to the trust
- 8 fund shall remain available until they are obligated or until
- 9 the trust fund is repealed.
- 10 (d) The trust fund shall be repealed on July 1, 2045. The
- 11 commission shall transfer to the credit of the state general
- 12 fund, all unexpended or unencumbered balances remaining in the
- 13 trust fund prior to June 30, 2045; provided that all unexpended
- 14 or unencumbered balances of federal moneys shall be disbursed in
- 15 accordance with applicable federal law.
- 16 § -12 Severability. If any provision of this chapter or
- 17 the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
- 18 invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or
- 19 applications of this chapter that can be given effect without
- 20 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
- 21 provisions of this chapter are severable."



- 1 SECTION 2. It is the express intent of the legislature and
- 2 this Act to not obstruct, deny, or revoke any rights or
- 3 privileges heretofore exercised by the United States Army in its
- 4 use of Makua valley throughout the term of its lease.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
