A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that an austere state
 economy dictates a review of all sources of income to maximize
 the utilization of state funds. This review is necessary to
 ensure basic programs in health, public safety, education, and
 the environment are not ignored.

6 This Act redirects certain state funds to provide continued 7 maintenance and support for state environmental programs such as 8 invasive species control and mitigation and reforestation and 9 sediment run-off mitigation.

10 SECTION 2. Section 171-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

12 "(a) There is created in the department a special fund to 13 be designated as the "special land and development fund". 14 Subject to the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920, as 15 amended, and section 5(f) of the Admission Act of 1959, all 16 proceeds of sale of public lands, including interest on deferred payments; all moneys collected under section 171-58 for mineral 17 18 and water rights; all rents from leases, licenses, and permits HB LRB 09-1667.doc

derived from public lands; all moneys collected from lessees of 1 2 public lands within industrial parks; all fees, fines, and other 3 administrative charges collected under this chapter and chapter 4 183C; a portion of the highway fuel tax collected under chapter 243; all moneys collected by the department for the commercial 5 6 use of public trails and trail accesses under the jurisdiction 7 of the department; transient accommodations tax revenues 8 collected pursuant to section 237D-6.5(b)(2); and private 9 contributions for the management, maintenance, and development 10 of trails and accesses shall be set apart in the fund and shall 11 be used only as authorized by the legislature for the following 12 purposes: 13 (1)To reimburse the general fund of the State for advances made that are required to be reimbursed from 14 15 the proceeds derived from sales, leases, licenses, or permits of public lands; 16 For the planning, development, management, operations, 17 (2)or maintenance of all lands and improvements under the 18 19 control and management of the board, including but not 20 limited to permanent or temporary staff positions who may be appointed without regard to chapter 76; 21

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1	(3)	To repurchase any land, including improvements, in the
2		exercise by the board of any right of repurchase
3		specifically reserved in any patent, deed, lease, or
4		other documents or as provided by law;
5	(4)	For the payment of all appraisal fees; provided that
6		all fees reimbursed to the board shall be deposited in
7		the fund;
8	(5)	For the payment of publication notices as required
9		under this chapter; provided that all or a portion of
10		the expenditures may be charged to the purchaser or
11		lessee of public lands or any interest therein under
12		rules adopted by the board;
13	(6)	For the management, maintenance, and development of
14		trails and trail accesses under the jurisdiction of
15		the department;
16	(7)	For the payment to private land developers who have
17		contracted with the board for development of public
18		lands under section 171-60;
19	(8)	For the payment of debt service on revenue bonds
20		issued by the department, and the establishment of
21		debt service and other reserves deemed necessary by
22		the board;



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1	(9)	To reimburse the general fund for debt service on
2		general obligation bonds issued to finance
3		departmental projects, where the bonds are designated
4		to be reimbursed from the special land and development
5		fund;
6	(10)	For the protection, planning, management, and
7		regulation of water resources under chapter 174C;
8		[and]
9	(11)	For invasive species control and mitigation by the
10		invasive species council under chapter 194;
11	(12)	To promote reforestation and to mitigate sediment run-
12		off; and
13	[(11)]	(13) For other purposes of this chapter."
14	SECT	ION 3. Section 173A-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by	y amending subsection (h) to read as follows:
16	"(h)	The fund shall be used for:
17	(1)	The acquisition of interests or rights in land having
18		value as a resource to the State, whether in fee title
19		or through the establishment of permanent conservation
20		easements under chapter 198 or agricultural easements;
21	(2)	The payment of any debt service on state financial
22		instruments relating to the acquisition of interests
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1		or rights in land having value as a resource to the
2		State;
3	(3)	Annual administration costs for the fund, not to
4		exceed five per cent of annual fund revenues of the
5		previous year[; and]
6	(4)	Costs related to the operation, maintenance, and
7		management of lands acquired by way of this fund that
8		are necessary to protect, maintain, or restore
9		resources at risk on these lands, or that provide for
10		greater public access and enjoyment of these lands;
11		provided that the costs related to the operation,
12		maintenance, and management of lands acquired by way
13		of this fund do not exceed five per cent of annual
14		fund revenues of the previous year [-];
15	(5)	Invasive species control and mitigation by the
16		invasive species council under chapter 194; and
17	(6)	Reforestation and to mitigate sediment run-off."
18	SECT	ION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
20	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009, and
21	shall be :	repealed on June 30, 2013; provided that sections

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1 171-19 and 173A-5 shall be reenacted in the form in which they
