A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNEMPLOYMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that immediate, speedy 2 action must be taken to reduce unemployment in this State. The present decline in the health of the state and national 3 4 economies and the high rates of unemployment that will accompany 5 this decline will cause considerable hardship among the residents of the State. The legislature further finds it is 6 7 therefore prudent at this time to take steps to alleviate the 8 effects of a high rate of unemployment through the development 9 of a state unemployment program. The purpose of this Act is to: Assist unemployed persons who have used all available 10 (1) unemployment insurance benefits with employment in 11 12 needed public service jobs, and, whenever feasible, 13 related training and manpower services, to enable them to move into temporary full-time or part-time 14 15 employment or training supported under this chapter; 16 and



1	(2) Provide subsidies for certain private employers to
2	participate in the employment programs involving the
3	training and hiring of unemployed persons.
4	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
5	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
6	as follows:
7	"CHAPTER
8	STATE COMPREHENSIVE EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING PROGRAM
9	PART I. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	§ -1 Definitions . As used in this chapter, unless the
11	context clearly requires otherwise:
12	"Department" means the department of labor and industrial
13	relations.
14	"Director" means the director of labor and industrial
15	relations.
16	"Unemployed person" means a person who is without a job and
17	is able, available, and seeking full-time employment.
18	§ -2 Authority. (a) The director may create and
19	administer a statewide state-funded subsidized public service
20	employment program. In carrying out the program, the director
21	shall accord priority to individuals to be hired in the
22	following order:
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1 (1)Unemployed persons who have exhausted their 2 unemployment benefits; and 3 (2) All other unemployed persons that do not qualify for unemployment benefits. 4 5 Persons employed in public service jobs under this (b) 6 chapter shall not be paid wages below the state minimum wage. 7 (c) Persons under subsection (b) shall not be considered 8 state employees and shall not be subject to the provisions of law relating to state employment, including those regarding 9 hours of work, rates of compensation, leave, unemployment 10 11 compensation, and state employee benefits. 12 (d) For purposes of chapter 386, persons under subsection 13 (b) shall be deemed employees of the State within the meaning of 14 the term "employee" as defined in section 386-1, and the 15 provisions of that chapter shall apply. -3 Relationship of program under this part to other 16 S 17 state programs. The program under this part is a state-funded 18 program. Accordingly, the director shall not be required to 19 conform this program with that of other public service 20 employment programs.

21 The director, immediately upon enactment of this part,22 shall implement this part. The director shall coordinate the



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activities with any other federal, state, or county activities
 relating to public service employment, including but not limited
 to programs under chapters, 202, 394, and 394B, and sections
 208-5, 346-71, and 346-101.

5 § -4 Rules. The director shall adopt rules pursuant to
6 chapter 91 necessary for the purposes of this chapter.

7 § -5 Reports. The director shall report on the
8 progress of this chapter to the legislature annually.

9 PART II. STATE ASSISTANCE FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYMENT
10 § -11 State subsidy for certain employers. Any
11 employer, whether profit-making or nonprofit making, who agrees
12 to participate in an employment program to train and permanently
13 hire unemployed persons, shall be entitled to a state subsidy in
14 accordance with this part and rules as may be necessary.

15 § -12 Nature of subsidy. The subsidy shall be to defray 16 extra costs of providing employment and a program of training 17 and support services. It may be used for on-the-job training 18 and counseling, job orientation, job-related education, 19 instruction in English as a second language, medical and dental 20 services, transportation expenses, a portion of wages, and other 21 costs related to the employment.

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1 All subsidies shall be made directly to the employer by the 2 director. The amounts of the subsidies shall be determined by 3 the director in accordance with guidelines adopted by the 4 director, and all subsidies shall be incorporated into contracts 5 entered into between the director and the participating 6 employers.

7 -13 Limitations. No subsidy shall exceed \$ S 8 for one permanent job position. The maximum subsidy allowed to 9 any one employer shall be \$ or an amount not to exceed 10 twenty-five per cent of any one employer's workforce, whichever 11 is the lesser amount, except under exceptional circumstances as 12 determined by the director. The training subsidy for a given 13 position shall not exceed twenty weeks."

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 to implement section 2 of this Act.

18 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the director of 19 labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this Act. 20 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on the later of:

21 (1) July 1, 2009; or

22 (2) The date upon which:



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1 The State's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate (A) 2 is determined by the department of labor and 3 industrial relations to have exceeded seven per 4 cent; and 5 (B) The governor issues a proclamation that the events in subparagraph (A) have occurred and 6 publishes a notice statewide as provided in 7 section 1-28.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 8 9 and shall be repealed on June 30, 2010.
