## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DISASTER PREPAREDNESS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 2 3 as follows: 4 "CHAPTER 5 DISASTER PREPAREDNESS -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter: 6 7 "Commission" means the disaster preparedness commission. "Director" means the director of the office of disaster 8 9 preparedness. 10 "Disaster" means any natural or human-caused catastrophe, 11 the occurrence of which is unanticipated or difficult to 12 predict, that results in significant property damage, 13 agricultural loss, hardship, suffering, psychological disorders, medical difficulties, or loss of life within the state. 14 "Natural hazard" means hurricane, storm, flood, tsunami, 15 16 tidal wave, wind-driven water, earthquake, volcanic activity, volcanic smog or vog, lava flow, rockslide, earthslide, fire, or 17 18 other natural disaster.



- 1 "Vog" means the substance created when sulfur dioxide and 2 other volcanic gases combine and interact chemically in the atmosphere with oxygen, moisture, dust, and sunlight over a 3 period of time to form a visible haze consisting of gas and a 4 5 suspended mixture of tiny liquid and solid particles. 6 -2 Office of disaster preparedness established. \$ 7 is established in the department of transportation the office of 8 disaster preparedness. The director of the office shall be 9 nominated and, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, 10 appointed by the governor. The director shall serve for a 11 period of six years and thereafter until a successor is 12 appointed. The salary of the director shall be set at a rate no 13 greater than \$ a year and shall not be diminished 14 during the director's term of office unless by general law 15 applying to all salaried officers of the State. If the director 16 dies, resigns, becomes ineligible to serve, or is removed or 17 suspended from office, the first assistant to the director shall

- 22 State. The disaster preparedness plan shall include:

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a full term.

1	(1)	The identification of natural hazards;
2	(2)	The designation of natural hazard impact zones;
3	(3)	Priorities for natural hazard mitigation;
4	(4)	Policies, requirements, and incentives to mitigate the
5		problems caused by natural hazards, to be incorporated
6		into rules such as county building codes, land use
7		policies, and retrofitting incentives such as tax
8		credits; and
9	(5)	Plans for best responses to disasters to minimize
10		costs and protect the interests of residents, their
11		possessions, and pets, and visitors to the state,
12		including plans ensuring the reliability of
13		communication networks and power supplies for major
14		state airports, health care facilities, disaster
15		shelters, and other essential services.

- (b) The director shall report annually to the governor and the legislature no later than twenty days before the convening of each regular session of the legislature on the status of the disaster preparedness plan and shall include any necessary proposed legislation.

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- disaster preparedness commission within the department of 1

- 3 shall consist of seven members as follows:
- 4 (1)One member appointed by the governor;

- Four members appointed by the mayors of the counties 9 (4)10 of Honolulu, Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai, each of whom shall appoint one member. 11
- The commission shall select one of its members to serve as 12

- incurred in the performance of their official duties. 16
