A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by adding a new subpart to part II to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 3 HAWAII MEDICAL DOCTOR LOANS 4 §304A-A Hawaii medical doctor loans; eligibility; 5 6 There is created the Hawaii medical doctor loan amounts. 7 program to be administered by the University of Hawaii, to provide financial support to students who complete a state-8 9 approved medical school program at the University of Hawaii 10 and who agree to practice in rural areas of the State, as 11 designated by the University of Hawaii. Eligibility shall 12 be awarded by the university to students on a competitive 13 The amount to be loaned to a student shall be basis. 14 determined by the board of regents based upon need for 15 financial aid and proof of acceptance into a state-approved 16 medical school program at the university. payments and costs of textbooks and other instructional and
 laboratory materials necessary to complete a state-approved
 medical school program.

4 §304A-B Repayment of loans; late fees; rural area practice and loan repayment waiver; collection agency. (a) 5 6 All loans made under this subpart shall bear interest at 7 five per cent simple interest. Repayment of principal and 8 interest charges shall commence one year after graduation 9 or three months after a loan recipient ceases to be 10 enrolled in a state-approved medical school program at the 11 university and shall be paid in periodic installments 12 within a six-year period.

13 (b) The university shall charge late fees and all
14 other reasonable costs for the collection of delinquent
15 loans.

(c) Upon a showing of proof that the loan recipient
has completed a state-approved medical school program and
is practicing as a medical doctor in a rural area of the
State, as designated by the university, one-tenth of the
total amount of the loan and interest shall be waived for
every year of the first five years, and the remaining
balance shall be waived after the sixth year that a loan



1 recipient practices medicine in a rural area of the State, 2 as designated by the University of Hawaii. 3 (d) Once a loan recipient subject to this section 4 fails to practice medicine in a rural area of the State, as 5 designated by the university, for a minimum of ten 6 consecutive years from the loan recipient's original date 7 of employment with the university, excluding temporary 8 leaves of absence, then the university shall withdraw its 9 waiver of future repayments, and the loan recipient shall 10 repay any remaining loan balance at the rate of ten per 11 cent simple interest. 12 In accordance with chapter 103D, the university (e) 13 shall enter into written contracts with collection agencies 14 for the purpose of collecting delinquent student loans. 15 All payments collected, including late fees and all other 16 reasonable costs, exclusive of a collection agency's 17 commissions, shall revert and be credited to the revolving 18 fund established for the Hawaii medical doctor loan 19 program. A collection agency that enters into a written 20 contract with the university for the collection of 21 delinquent student loans, pursuant to this section, shall

- 22 collect a commission from the debtor in accordance with the
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1 terms of, and up to the amounts authorized in, the written
2 contract.

3 (f) Liability for repayment of a loan shall be
4 canceled upon the death or permanent total disability of
5 the loan recipient.

§304A-C Capacity of minors in qualifying for Hawaii 6 7 medical doctor loans. Any student otherwise gualifying for a loan under the Hawaii medical doctor loan program shall 8 9 not be disqualified because the student is under the age of 10 eighteen years, and for the purpose of applying for, receiving, and repaying the loan, the student shall be 11 12 deemed to have full legal capacity to act and shall have 13 all rights, powers, privileges, and obligations of an adult 14 with respect thereto.

15 §304A-D Rules governing Hawaii medical doctor loan 16 program. The university may adopt rules to implement the 17 Hawaii medical doctor loan program. The rules shall be 18 adopted pursuant to chapter 91 but shall be exempt from the 19 public notice and public hearing requirements.

20 §304A-E Medical doctor loan revolving fund. There is
21 established a revolving fund to be known as the medical
22 doctor loan revolving fund. The fund shall be a revolving



1 fund and all interest and payments received on account of 2 principal shall be credited to the fund. The fund shall be 3 administered by the board of regents and shall be disbursed 4 to qualified students who meet eligibility requirements 5 under section 304A-A pursuant to rules adopted by the 6 board."

7 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 8 or 9 so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-10 2010 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be 11 necessary for fiscal year 2010-2011 for deposit into the 12 medical doctor loan revolving fund established by this Act. 13 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the medical 14 doctor loan revolving fund the sum of \$ or so 15 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 16 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for 17 fiscal year 2010-2011 for the purposes of this Act.

18 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the19 University of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

20 SECTION 4. In codifying the new subpart added to
21 chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by section 1 of this
22 Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute appropriate
