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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new subpart to part II to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	" . HAWAII MEDICAL DOCTOR LOANS
5	§304A-A Hawaii medical doctor loans; eligibility; amounts.
6	There is created the Hawaii medical doctor loan program to be
7	administered by the University of Hawaii, to provide financial
8	support to:
9	(1) Students who complete a state-approved medical school
10	program at the University of Hawaii; or
11	(2) Graduates of a medical school who have received
12	medical training from a Hawaii-based medical program,
13	and who agree to practice in rural areas of the state, as
14	designated by the University of Hawaii. Loans shall be awarded
15	by the university to students on a competitive basis. The
16	amount to be loaned to a student shall be determined by the
17	board of regents based upon need for financial aid and proof of
18	acceptance into a state-approved medical school program at the
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university. The maximum aggregate amount of loans that a
 student may receive under this program shall be an amount
 equivalent to tuition payments and costs of textbooks and other
 instructional and laboratory materials necessary to complete a
 state-approved medical school program.

§304A-B Repayment of loans; late fees; rural area practice
and loan repayment waiver; collection agency. (a) All loans
made under this subpart shall bear interest at five per cent
simple interest. Repayment of principal and interest shall
commence one year after graduation or three months after a loan
recipient ceases to:

12 (1) Be enrolled in a state-approved medical school program13 at the university; or

14 (2) Receive medical training from a Hawaii-based medical15 program, and

16 shall be paid in periodic installments within a six-year period.
17 (b) The university shall charge late fees and all other
18 reasonable costs for the collection of delinquent loans.

(c) Upon a showing of proof that the loan recipient has
completed a state-approved medical school program or has
received medical training from a Hawaii-based medical program

22 and is practicing as a medical doctor in a rural area of the



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1 state, as designated by the university, one-tenth of the total 2 amount of the loan and interest shall be waived for every year 3 of the first five years, and the remaining balance shall be 4 waived after the sixth year that a loan recipient practices 5 medicine in a rural area of the state, as designated by the 6 University of Hawaii.

7 (d) Once a loan recipient subject to this section fails to 8 practice medicine in a rural area of the state, as designated by 9 the university, for a minimum of ten consecutive years from the 10 loan recipient's original date of employment, excluding 11 temporary leaves of absence, then the university shall withdraw 12 its waiver of future repayments, and the loan recipient shall 13 repay any remaining loan balance at the rate of ten per cent 14 simple interest.

15 (e) In accordance with chapter 103D, the university shall 16 enter into written contracts with collection agencies for the 17 purpose of collecting delinguent student loans. All payments 18 collected, including late fees and all other reasonable costs, 19 exclusive of a collection agency's commissions, shall revert and 20 be credited to the Hawaii medical doctor loan program revolving 21 fund. A collection agency that enters into a written contract 22 with the university for the collection of delinquent student

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loans, pursuant to this section, shall collect a commission from
 the debtor in accordance with the terms of, and up to the
 amounts authorized in, the written contract.

4 (f) Liability for repayment of a loan shall be canceled
5 upon the death or permanent total disability of the loan
6 recipient.

7 §304A-C Capacity of minors in gualifying for Hawaii 8 medical doctor loans. Any student otherwise qualifying for a 9 loan under the Hawaii medical doctor loan program shall not be 10 disqualified because the student is under the age of eighteen 11 years, and for the purpose of applying for, receiving, and 12 repaying the loan, the student shall be deemed to have full 13 legal capacity to act and shall have all rights, powers, 14 privileges, and obligations of an adult with respect thereto.

15 §304A-D Rules governing Hawaii medical doctor loan
16 program. The university may adopt rules to implement the Hawaii
17 medical doctor loan program. The rules shall be adopted
18 pursuant to chapter 91 but shall be exempt from the public
19 notice and public hearing requirements.

20 §304A-E Hawaii medical doctor loan program revolving fund.
21 There is established a revolving fund to be known as the Hawaii
22 medical doctor loan program revolving fund. The fund shall be a HB991 HD2 HMS 2009-2759

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1 revolving fund and all interest and payments received on account 2 of principal shall be credited to the fund. The fund shall be 3 administered by the board of regents and shall be disbursed to 4 qualified students who meet eligibility requirements under 5 section 304A-A pursuant to rules adopted by the board." 6 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and 9 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 10 year 2010-2011 for deposit into the Hawaii medical doctor loan 11 program revolving fund established by this Act. 12 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii medical 13 doctor loan program revolving fund the sum of \$ or so 14 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and 15 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 16 year 2010-2011 for the purposes of this Act. 17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University 18 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 4. In codifying the new subpart added to chapter
304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by section 1 of this Act, the
revisor of statutes shall substitute appropriate section numbers

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for the letters used in designating the new sections in this
 Act.
 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
