HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES AND OTHER STATE AGENCIES RECOGNIZE THE IMPORTANCE OF AND ASSIST IN THE PRESERVATION OF THE NU`UANU `AUWAI SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, ancient Hawaiian tradition held fresh water as a

treasure from the gods, with each person along its way using 2 that gift having a duty to the person below to preserve it for 3 4 use by others; and 5 WHEREAS, the waters of Nu`uanu start at its highest point 6 in the Ko`olau mountains with the waterfalls of Waipuhia and 7 Waipuilani, feeding the steams of Nu`uanu, Mo`ole, and Waolani; 8 and 9 10 WHEREAS, ancient Hawaiian inhabitants of Nu`uanu Valley 11 developed an `auwai or water ditch system to take the waters 12 from the three streams and distribute the waters to irrigate 13 extensive lo`i ai or taro fields that were present throughout 14 15 the entire valley, from its upper reaches down to below the present Judd Street; and 16 17 WHEREAS, after damage to the `auwai system during the 18 battle of Nu`uanu, Kamehameha moved to quickly restore the 19 valley's agriculture production, summoning Kuho`oheiheipahu Paki 20 to rebuild the irrigation system; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, "in three days, [Paki] rallied several hundred men to construct the tremendous Nu`uanu irrigation system which 24 supplies the numerous pondfields....this irrigation system is 25 26 known even today as the Paki `auwai" ; and 27 28 WHEREAS, as Nu`uanu evolved from an extensive agricultural area into a residential area, many residents did not realize the 29 existence of or care about the ancient ``auwai system traversing 30 the valley and in many instances, parts of the Nu'uanu `auwai 31

1 system were purposely closed, diverted, or covered up and as a result, out of fourteen original `auwai there are only about 2 3 eight that remain either flowing or reparable; and

WHEREAS, the Nu`uanu Valley `Auwai Study Group is doing its 5 best to spread information on the historic origins of the 6 Nu`uanu `auwai system and attempting to educate property owners 7 on the value of ways of preserving this treasure; and 8

WHEREAS, the Hawaii Historic Foundation, together with the 10 State Historic Preservation Division of the Department of Land 11 12 and Natural Resources, has named the `Auwai of Nu`uanu Valley as one of the nine most endangered historic places on its 2008 List 13 of endangered places; now, therefore, 14

16 IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the BE Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 17 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Land and 18 Natural Resources and all other state agencies are requested to 19 20 do everything in their respective areas of responsibility to protect and preserve the `auwai of Nu`uanu Valley; and 21 22

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 24 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, 25 Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, Historic 26 Hawaii Foundation, and Nu`uanu Valley `Auwai Study Group.
