HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING STATE DEPARTMENTS TO USE TRADITIONAL HAWAIIAN NAMES WHEN IDENTIFYING FISHPONDS.

WHEREAS, Native Hawaiians constructed nearly 500 fishponds 1 in Hawai'i beginning in the 13th century, including the 523-acre 2 Keahupua o Maunalua Pond, the largest fishpond in Polynesia; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, Hawai'i's fishponds represent one of the most advanced fish husbandry techniques among the original peoples of 6 7 the Pacific; and 8 WHEREAS, fishponds reinforced traditional cultural values 9 of community and solidarity since the construction of each was a 10 monumental task requiring the cooperation of every family in the 11 12 ahupua'a; and 13 WHEREAS, the unique fishponds of Hawai'i have sustained 14 Native Hawaiians since ancient times; and 15 16 WHEREAS, fishponds are often fed by springs and provide a 17 favorable environment for fish, limu, and a wide variety of 18 other marine, terrestrial, and plant species; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the fishponds provided a source of fish when it 21 was not available from the ocean due to weather and surf, or was 22 kapu during spawning season; and 23 24 WHEREAS, this life-giving function of fishponds has been 25 obscured in recent years by the use of such terms as "lagoon," 26 "lake," "basin," "ditch," and "loch;" and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, sole reliance on Tax Map Key numbers and terms such as "remnant" and "vacant" lands has led to the exclusion of 30 31 traditional Hawaiian names; and

WHEREAS, fishponds are quickly disappearing due to 1 continuing urban development; and 2 3 WHEREAS, restoring fishponds will help address the shortage 4 of healthy local food products and promote sustainability; now, 5 6 therefore, 7 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 8 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 9 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that state departments are 10 requested to use traditional Hawaiian names when identifying 11 fishponds; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 14 15 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, and the Director or Chairperson of each state department and the Board 16 17 of Land and Natural Resources. 18 19 20
