HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE PROVISION OF ORIENTATION AND ADDITIONAL TRAINING TO INCREASE THE ABILITY OF STATE AGENCY CASE WORKERS TO ADDRESS THE ISSUES FACED BY GRANDPARENTS RAISING GRANDCHILDREN.

WHEREAS, as a result of the work of the Joint Legislative
 Committee on Family Caregiving, Act 11, Special Session Laws of
 Hawaii 2008, established a Grandparents Raising Grandchildren
 Task Force to assess and report on the needs and issues of
 grandparents raising grandchildren; and

7 WHEREAS, the final report generated by the Grandparents 8 Raising Grandchildren Task Force found as a result of a March 9 2009 Grandparents Raising Grandchildren (GRG) Focus Group, that 10 participants with grandchildren in custody of Child Protective 11 Services (CPS), Department of Human Services (DHS), expressed 12 common frustration with DHS case workers because grandparents 13 may not have received enough information from DHS workers; and 14

15 WHEREAS, observations in the March 2009 GRG Focus Group 16 show that:

- 18 (1) Grandparents have little or no understanding of laws
 19 that drive a CPS case and may misunderstand the role
 20 of a DHS case worker;
- (2) Grandparents raising grandchildren often feel afraid,
 intimidated, helpless and angry;
- (3) Many grandparents raising grandchildren do not seek
 help from DHS because they are afraid that "the
 system" will remove their grandchildren from their
 care;
 - (4) Some DHS case workers:
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Do not respect cultural values related to the 1 (A) 2 sacredness of the grandparent/grandchild relationship: 3 4 5 (B) Do not respect the senior as the grandparent with knowledge about the history of the child's 6 7 family; 8 (C) Do not acknowledge a grandparent's right to have 9 a view of the best interest of their 10 grandchildren; and 11 12 13 (D) Do not provide the grandparent with emotional support; rather the grandparents reported 14 distress in relations with some workers; and 15 16 Many grandparents do not know about current laws and 17 (5) subsidies that are designed to help and protect them; 18 19 now, therefore, 20 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 22 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Human 23 Services is urged to provide orientation and additional training 24 to increase the ability of DHS case workers to address the 25 issues faced by grandparents who raise grandchildren, including 26 27 increasing case workers' awareness about: 28 Local cultural beliefs regarding the important roles 29 (1)of grandparents within the family structure, 30 especially when grandchildren need care; 31 32 What grandparents experience (fear, helplessness, and 33 (2)anger) when their grandchildren are taken into custody 34 by Child Protective Services or placed in foster care, 35 and there are rules for having contacts with their 36 grandchildren; and 37 38 (3) Grandparents' need for clear explanations to 39 understand guidelines for managing cases involving 40 children in state custody who need foster care and a 41 safe permanent home; and 42 43



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human 1 2 Services is requested to submit a report to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the 2011 3 Regular Session on the initiatives the Department has 4 5 implemented to increase the ability of DHS case workers to understand and address the issues faced by grandparents who 6 7 raise grandchildren; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human 10 Services, the Director of the Executive Office on Aging, the 11 County Executive of the City and County of Honolulu Elderly 12 13 Affairs Division, the Coordinator for the Department of Health Foster Care Licensing Unit, and the Administrator of the Social 14 Services Division of the Department of Human Services. 15 16
