### HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

#### RELATING TO HEALTH SYSTEM TASK FORCE.

WHEREAS, improving the quality, safety, efficiency, and 1 2 cost of medical care is universally regarded as a primary goal of healthcare reform in Hawaii; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Hawaii's healthcare system is perceived to have 5 difficulty in attracting and retaining physicians to practice in 6 the State, particularly in rural areas; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, various factors have been identified over the years as contributors to the perceived inability to attract and 10 keep physicians in practice, including the adequacy of 11 reimbursements for services provided; the cost of malpractice 12 insurance premiums, particularly for certain medical 13 specialties; and the need to practice medicine defensively; and 14 15 WHEREAS, previous efforts at piecemeal reform of the 16 healthcare system have been largely unsuccessful in improving 17 the quality, safety, efficiency, and cost of medical care in 18 Hawaii; and 19 20 WHEREAS, improving the healthcare system requires analysis 21 and evaluation of the system as a whole to identify and improve 22 those factors that contribute to identifiable weaknesses; and 23 24 WHEREAS, it is time for a new approach to healthcare reform 25 in Hawaii which seeks to examine the core issues that contribute 26 to system weaknesses by enlisting a coalition of interested 27 parties to develop new approaches to reform; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the primary objective of this coalition would be 30 to bring stakeholders in Hawaii to a neutral forum to assist in 31 developing new policies and laws that strengthen the healthcare 32 system through a factually-based consensus-building process, 33 34 while emphasizing that healthcare system reform must strengthen

1 links between accountability and improvement in the quality of 2 patient care and safety; and 3 4 WHEREAS, it is necessary to evaluate methods to reduce medical errors and increase patient safety; seek solutions to 5 eliminate doctor shortages; address the role and impact of the 6 legal system in compensating victims injured because of medical 7 errors; and improve the quality, safety, efficiency, and cost of 8 9 Hawaii's healthcare system; and 10 11 WHEREAS, this coalition has the long-term goal of 12 recommending proposed legislation; now, therefore, 13 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-Fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 15 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the chairs of the Senate 16 and House Committees on Health, or their designees, are 17 18 requested to convene a task force to: 19 20 (1)Evaluate methods to improve the quality, safety, efficiency, and cost of Hawaii's healthcare system; 21 22 23 (2) Reduce medical errors and increase patient safety; 24 25 (3) Seek solutions to eliminate doctor shortages; and 26 27 (4) Address the role and impact of the legal system in compensating victims injured because of medical 28 errors; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 31 32 include the following: 33 34 (1)The President of the Senate, or the President's designee; 35 36 (2) The Speaker of the House of Representatives, or the 37 Speaker's designee; 38 39 The Insurance Commissioner, or the Insurance 40 (3) 41 Commissioner's designee; 42 The Dean of the William S. Richardson School of Law, 43 (4) 44 or the Dean's designee;
