HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR THE CANCER RESEARCH CENTER OF HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, the Cancer Research Center of Hawaii was established by the Board of Regents of the University of Hawaii 2 in 1981; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the mission of the Cancer Research Center of 5 Hawaii is to reduce the burden of cancer through research, 6 education, and outreach, with an emphasis on the unique ethnic, 7 8 cultural, and environmental characteristics of Hawaii and the Pacific; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Cancer Research Center of Hawaii is a research 11 unit of the University of Hawaii at Manoa and currently employs 12 two hundred eighty people, of whom thirty-four are core faculty; 13 14 and 15 WHEREAS, the Cancer Research Center of Hawaii currently 16 conducts more than one hundred research projects in four 17 programs: epidemiology, with a focus on nutrition, 18 biostatistics, and genetics; natural products, which includes 19 chemistry, cell and molecular biology, botany, biochemistry, 20 21 immunology, and pharmacology; prevention and control, which focuses on clinical aspects of cancer and the reduction of 22 cancer incidence through interventions; and carcinogenesis, 23 which examines how environmental and chemical carcinogens, 24 viruses, and genetics interact; and 25 26 WHEREAS, it is estimated that 1,300,000 people in the 27

28 United States will be diagnosed with cancer this year, and in 29 Hawaii, approximately five thousand men and women are diagnosed 30 with the disease each year; and 31

WHEREAS, in November 2009, the University of Hawaii at
Manoa announced plans to build a new cancer research facility in
Kakaako, with construction expected to begin in 2010; and

1 WHEREAS, since 1996, the Cancer Research Center of Hawaii 2 3 has been a designated cancer center of the National Cancer Institute and must meet strict standards to receive this 4 designation and support; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the distinction of being a designated cancer 7 center of the National Cancer Institute recognizes a cancer 8 center's scientific excellence and capability to integrate a 9 diversity of research approaches to focus on the problem of 10 cancer; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Cancer Research Center of Hawaii is one of 13 14 only sixty-five National Cancer Institute designated centers in the United States, and is the only designated cancer center in 15 16 Hawaii; and 17 WHEREAS, four years ago, the National Cancer Institute 18 recommended that the Cancer Research Center of Hawaii expand its 19 capacity to house more researchers and physicians; this 20 recommendation will be addressed with the construction of the 21 22 new facility; and 23 WHEREAS, the unique and varied ethnic composition of the 24 State presents researchers with opportunities to decrease the 25 burden of cancer in high-risk groups, and to develop novel 26 27 preventative and clinical strategies for the people of Hawaii; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the Cancer Research Center of Hawaii will work in 30 a consortium composed of the University of Hawaii at Manoa's 31 John A. Burns School of Medicine, The Queen's Medical Center, 32 Hawaii Pacific Health, and other hospitals to offer patients the 33 latest cancer therapies and clinical trials that would not 34 35 otherwise be available; and 36 WHEREAS, a cutting edge research facility will help attract 37 and retain top tier researchers; foster synergy and innovation 38 among physicians, researchers, and students; and increase space 39 and resource efficiencies, while bringing to the State 40 \$25,000,000 to \$30,000,000 in grant funding annually; and 41 42 WHEREAS, the unique geographical location of Hawaii makes 43 it imperative for the Cancer Research Center of Hawaii to 44 2010-1538 HCR18 SD1 SMA.doc
