HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO CONSIDER CERTAIN FACTORS BEFORE ENTERING INTO CONTRACTS WITH MANAGED CARE ORGANIZATIONS THAT PROVIDE MEDICAID BENEFITS UNDER QUEST MANAGED CARE PLANS.

1 WHEREAS, various complaints regarding inefficiencies, 2 including issues with co-payments and prescription-drug 3 coverage, have surfaced concerning the provision of Medicaid 4 benefits under the QUEST program administered by the Department 5 of Human Services; and 6

7 WHEREAS, in response, legislation has been introduced to 8 require the Department of Human Services to terminate the QUEST 9 program on June 30, 2011, and restore the medical assistance 10 programs that QUEST replaced, including the state health 11 insurance program; and

13 WHEREAS, the restoration of prior medical assistance 14 programs would be conditioned upon the provision of benefits 15 similar to those provided by the QUEST program; and

17 WHEREAS, concerns have also been raised with regard to the 18 waiver received by the State from the Centers for Medicare and 19 Medicaid Services pursuant to section 1115 waiver of the Social 20 Security Act, which authorizes the operation of Hawaii's QUEST 21 program as an experimental demonstration or pilot project; and 22

WHEREAS, the termination of QUEST requires coordination
with and approval from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
Services, making the establishment of a deadline for termination
difficult; and

28 WHEREAS, rather than entirely terminating and replacing the29 QUEST program, now, therefore,

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1 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 2 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Human 3 Services is requested to consider certain factors before 4 5 entering into contracts with managed care organizations that provide Medicaid benefits under QUEST managed care plans; and 6 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, with respect to contracts 9 entered into after January 1, 2011, for provision of medical benefits to non-pregnant adults over eighteen years of age, the 10 Department of Human Services is requested to consider the 11 12 following factors: 13 Whether the managed-care health plan includes 14 (1)15 provisions for co-payments, which are not less than \$5 and not more than \$20 for each: 16 17 Office visit; 18 (A) 19 20 (B) Filling or re-filling of a drug prescription; 21 22 Outpatient service; and (C) 23 Emergency-room visit; 24 (D) 25 26 and are not applied to inpatient admission or 27 services; 28 29 Whether the proposed co-payment schedules in each (2) managed-care health plan are acceptable, prior to 30 implementation by the managed-care organization; 31 32 Whether the managed-care health plan has a formulary 33 (3) 34 for prescription-drug coverage; and 35 36 (4) How the medical necessity provision pursuant to section 432E-1.4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is applied 37 with respect to health care coverage provided under 38 39 each managed-care health plan; and 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human 41 Services is requested to report annually to the Legislature on 42 43 the aggregate number of recipients receiving benefits under both

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1 QUEST and a private health care plan no later than twenty days prior to the convening of each Regular Session; and 2 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 5 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human Services, who in turn is requested to transmit copies to managed 6 care organizations that provide Medicaid benefits under QUEST 7 8 managed care plans. 9 10
