## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEVELOPMENT AND AIRING OF PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS ON COMMERCIAL PASSENGER AIR FLIGHTS TO THE STATE ON THE IMPORTANCE OF CARING FOR THE STATE'S UNIQUE AND FRAGILE ECOSYSTEM.

1 WHEREAS, the Hawaiian monk seal is one of the rarest marine 2 mammals in the world, and among the world's most endangered 3 species, with the population currently declining at four per 4 cent annually and estimated at fewer than one thousand two 5 hundred individuals; and

7 WHEREAS, food limitations, entanglements in marine debris, 8 and human interactions including being caught as bycatch in 9 fishing gear, mother-pup disturbance on beaches, and exposure to 10 disease all threaten the remaining population; and

12 WHEREAS, in 2008, the Hawaiian monk seal was designated as 13 the State's mammal to increase awareness of it as an endangered 14 species with the hope that this awareness would result in 15 increased protection and its repopulation; and

WHEREAS, although the main Hawaiian island seals are a small population, they are a much healthier population and are slightly increasing in numbers rather than declining like the larger northern Hawaiian island population; and

22 WHEREAS, two recent incidents of intentionally killed monk 23 seals on Kauai and one on Molokai have brought attention to the 24 human threat to the seals; and

WHEREAS, in September, a Kauai man plead guilty to shooting a seal in violation of the federal Endangered Species Act and received a ninety-day jail term, one year supervised release, and a \$25 fine; and 30

1 WHEREAS, seal advocates and volunteers worry that such a sentence sends the wrong message to Hawaii residents and 2 visitors regarding the value of the Hawaiian monk seal; and 3 4 WHEREAS, a comprehensive outreach program for Hawaii 5 6 residents and visitors regarding the importance of the Hawaiian monk seal and other endangered Hawaiian flora and fauna needs to 7 be firmly established; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Hawaii residents and visitors need ready-access to 10 information on the State's unique and fragile ecosystems, 11 recommendations on how to care for the State's ecosystems, and 12 information on how to behave if one comes into contact with an 13 14 Hawaiian monk seal; now, therefore, 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 17 18 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is requested to work in cooperation with the 19 Department of Transportation to develop and air public service 20 announcements on commercial passenger air flights to the State; 21 22 and 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is 24 25 requested to include: 26 27 (1) Information on the State's unique and fragile ecosystems; 28 29 30 (2) Recommendations for visitors and residents on how to care for the State's ecosystems; 31 32 33 (3) Information focusing on the Hawaiian monk seal and how to behave if encountered; and 34 35 (4) Information on applicable federal and state laws with 36 regard to endangered species; and 37 38 39
