## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY TO DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A SUSTAINABLE PLAN TO REPAIR ALL PUBLIC HOUSING UNITS IN NEED OF MAINTENANCE.

WHEREAS, the current fiscal climate has resulted in high 1 2 unemployment rates, with many families losing income sources; 3 and 4 5 WHEREAS, without viable sources of income, these families 6 have been unable to pay for housing costs, dramatically increasing the homeless population and the need for reasonably-7 priced public housing; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, even without the additional strain on the public housing system caused by the economy, there is a significant 11 wait list for available public housing units; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the availability of clean, safe, and decent 14 housing can play a significant role in an individual's emergence 15 16 from poverty; and 17 WHEREAS, according to the January 2010 "State Occupancy 18 Report, " only 24 of 364 vacant units were "rent ready" and 19 available for immediate occupancy; and 20 21 WHEREAS, including those units that are currently occupied, 22 much of the Hawaii Public Housing Authority's (HPHA) inventory 23 24 of affordable housing projects is nearly 60 years old and in a 25 state of disrepair and deterioration; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the State's limited fiscal resources have been compounding the problem of deteriorating public housing, as 28 29 cost-cutting efforts have resulted in both the acquisition of minimal quality infrastructure and an inability to maintain that 30 31 infrastructure on an ongoing basis; and

WHEREAS, HPHA's current five-year plan, approved by the 1 United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, 2 3 includes provisions to improve the tenant rent collection to allow for more repair and renovation of existing public housing 4 5 units; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that HPHA Board, in its 8 efforts to provide lower income families with decent, safe, and 9 sanitary housing, has been actively exploring ways to accomplish the renovation and repair of the State's public housing 10 11 inventory; now, therefore, 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 14 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature urges the 15 Hawaii Public Housing Authority to develop and implement a 16 17 sustainable plan to repair all public housing units in need of maintenance; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that HPHA is urged to consider ways 20 in which necessary renovations and maintenance may be undertaken 21 22 at reduced or no cost through collaboration with the Department of Public Safety, the construction trades, and other relevant 23 entities; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 26 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the 27 Chairperson of the Hawaii Public Housing Authority Board of 28 Directors, and the Director of Public Safety. 29 30 31
