## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

## REQUESTING A SUNRISE REVIEW OF A PROPOSAL TO REGULATE ATHLETIC TRAINERS.

WHEREAS, athletic trainers are health care professionals 1 2 who specialize in the prevention, assessment, immediate care, treatment, referral, and rehabilitation of injuries and 3 4 illnesses sustained by athletes and others engaged in physical 5 activity; and 6 WHEREAS, athletic trainers are employed in public and 7 private secondary schools, colleges and universities, physician 8 offices, hospitals, sports medicine clinics, the military, and 9 10 fitness centers; and 11 WHEREAS, there are currently one hundred sixty-five 12 certified athletic trainers in the State of Hawaii; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, Hawaii is one of only four states that does not currently regulate the practice of athletic training; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the continued lack of regulation creates the risk 18 19 that individuals who have lost or are unable to obtain licensure in another state will move to the State to practice, thereby 20 putting the public in danger and degrading the standards of the 21 profession as a whole; and 22 23 WHEREAS, because the public has difficulty discerning the 24 difference between athletic trainers, personal trainers, and 25 boxing trainers, there is a risk that unqualified non-26 credentialed persons will represent themselves as "trainers" and 27 mislead members of the public into believing that they are 28 receiving care from health care professionals; and 29 30 31 WHEREAS, there is a risk that Hawaii's athletic population 32 could suffer consequences such as chronic pain, disability, or



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loss of life if health care is received from unqualified 1 2 practitioners; and 3 WHEREAS, there is a pressing and immediate need to regulate 4 the profession of athletic training in order to protect the 5 public health, safety, and welfare, especially since athletic 6 trainers often work with elementary and secondary school age 7 8 children; and 9 10 WHEREAS, section 26H-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires regulatory measures that would subject unregulated professions 11 12 and vocations to regulatory controls to be referred to the Auditor for analysis; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 2601, S.D. 1, introduced and amended during the 2010 Regular Session, proposes to regulate 16 17 athletic trainers through registration; now, therefore, 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 20 21 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the Auditor is requested to conduct a sunrise review of the registration of athletic 22 trainers as proposed under Senate Bill No. 2601, S.D. 1; and 23 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to submit findings and recommendations, including any proposed 26 legislation, to the Legislature not later than twenty days 27 before the convening of the Regular Session of 2011; and 28 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor. 31 32 33 34 OFFERED BY:
