REQUESTING THE HAWAII FARM BUREAU TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO EXPLORE LEASING OR RENTING PUBLIC SCHOOL CAFETERIAS TO VALUE-ADDED FOOD PROCESSORS TO PROMOTE THE USE OF LOCALLY-GROWN FRESH PRODUCE IN SCHOOL MEALS.

3 4 5 6 7 8	WHEREAS, the National Survey of Children's Health for Hawaii reports that seventeen and three-tenths per cent of public school children are overweight, and eleven and two-tenths per cent are obese; and		
9 10 11 12	WHEREAS, nearly eighty-four per cent of school-aged children in Hawaii eat more than the daily recommended amount of fat; and		
13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, nearly thirty per cent of school-aged children in Hawaii eat less than one serving of vegetables a day and nearly fifty per cent of school-aged children eat less than one serving a fruit a day; and		
17 18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, most public school cafeterias are used for only a limited amount of time during the school day and on the weekend; and		
22 23 24 25 26	WHEREAS, the Legislature, agricultural community, parents, nd other interested parties have looked at methods to increase ne amount and variety of locally-grown fresh produce in our ablic schools through farm-to-school programs and focused cocurement policy; and		
27 28 29	WHEREAS, leasing or renting cafeteria space to value-added processors to incorporate locally-grown produce into the school
