(6) Requiring that the tires be stored in a manner consistent with fire prevention and vector control;

6 WHEREAS, there are few tire recycling facilities in the 7 state, making it difficult for tire retailers and wholesalers to 8 comply with these requirements; and

10 WHEREAS, there are reports that some tire collection 11 services are not carrying out their responsibilities to properly 12 deliver used tires they have collected from tire retailers and 13 wholesalers for a fee, to the tire recycling facilities, and the 14 tires are instead found in illegal dump sites, particularly on 15 the Waianae Coast; and

WHEREAS, the implementation of a used tire collection system that requires a tire collection service to deliver the used tires to the recycling facility before the tire collection receives payment, would improve this situation; now, therefore, 21

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Health is urged to develop and implement a voucher system for tire collection services whereby the tire collection service is required to deliver the used tires to the recycling facility before the tire collection service may receive payment; and
