HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO SET A REQUIRED MINIMUM NUMBER OF INSTRUCTIONAL DAYS PER SCHOOL YEAR.

1	WHEREAS, Hawaii has experienced an unprecedented economic
2	downturn; and

4	WHEREAS, state departments and agencies have implemented
5	across-the-board budget restrictions and other expenditure
6	reductions due to decreased revenue collections; and
7 8	WHEREAS, state departments and agencies took a portion of
o 9	budget reductions through labor savings in the form of
9 10	furloughs; and

12	WHEREAS, it is essential to minimize the number of furlough
13	days and ensure furloughs are implemented in a manner that will
14	have the least possible impact on public services; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, providing instruction and educational
17	opportunities to our children are the most vital and important
18	services offered by the Department of Education; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, the Department of Education's implementation of
21	furloughs has impacted students by reducing the number of
22	instructional days, from an average of 180 days per school year to 163 days for the 2009-2010 school year and a similar decline
23 24	for school year 2010-2011; and
24 25	TOT SCHOOL YEAT 2010-2011, and
26	WHEREAS, other states such as Washington, Rhode Island,
27	Maryland, Michigan, and Montana require by law a minimum number
28	of instructional days per school year; and

30	WHEREAS, the education of Hawaii's children must be the top
31	priority of the Department of Education, even in times of
32	reduced revenues and dwindling resources; and
