HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ESTABLISHING AN ARCHAEOLOGICAL WORKING GROUP TO RECOMMEND ARCHAEOLOGICAL PRACTICE GUIDELINES FOR THE STATE INCLUDING LICENSING AND PROFESSIONAL OVERSIGHT.

WHEREAS, the State Historic Preservation Division of the 1 Department of Land and Natural Resources is charged with 2 3 accepting archaeological reports that meet the requirements of title 13, chapters 275, 276, 280, and 284, Hawaii Administrative 4 5 Rules; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the State Historic Preservation Division of the Department of Land and Natural Resources is also charged with 8 9 permitting archaeological work in the State of Hawaii in accordance with the requirements of title 13, chapter 282, 10 Hawaii Administrative Rules; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, the adequacy of some archaeological inventory 14 surveys that meet the requirements of title 13, chapter 275, Hawaii Administrative Rules, has been challenged by 15 archaeologists, native Hawaiians, and developers; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, the State Historic Preservation Division is authorized by section 6E-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to adopt 19 administrative rules; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, an archaeological working group was created in 23 2006 to address deficiencies in the State Historic Preservation 24 Program; and 25 WHEREAS, there was agreement that archaeological practices, 26 including reporting, survey practices, and accreditation could 27 28 be improved, but no action items were generated; and 29 30 WHEREAS, the profession of archaeology is currently not 31 licensed; and 32

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WHEREAS, licensing of the archaeology profession could 1 2 result in increased professionalism and greater consistency in the quality of the research and analysis in the reports; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, there is a broad constituency interested in preserving archaeological sites; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, many developers and landowners are interested in 9 preserving their rights to develop land with archaeological sites; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, all of these constituents should have input into 13 the development of archaeological guidelines for the State of 14 Hawaii; now, therefore, 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 16 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 17 18 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Land and 19 Natural Resources establish an archaeological working group to **20** · build on the work of the 2006 archaeological working group in 21 the area of developing professional practice quidelines for archaeological work in Hawaii; and 22 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the membership of this archaeological working group shall include staff from the State 25 Historic Preservation Division, a representative of the Island 26 Burial Council, two representatives from the Society for 27 Hawaiian Archaeology, a representative from the military 28 29 branches; one representative from the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs, a representative from the Chamber of Commerce and 30 two representatives designated by the Chairperson of the Board 31 32 of the Land and Natural Resources; and 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the purpose of the 34 35 archaeological working group is limited to creating guidelines to professionalize the practice of archaeology in Hawaii. 36 In 37 assessing practices and establishing archaeological guidelines, the archaeological working group is also urged to make 38 recommendations on licensing and professional oversight for 39 archaeology in Hawaii and to make recommendations as to the 40 41 appropriate agency to oversee the regulation of licensing the profession of archaeology. In making recommendations, the 42 43 archaeological working group shall acknowledge balance between research, preservation, and land development that provides 44

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guidance and consistency for both the State Historic 1 2 Preservation Division and developers; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the archaeological working 5 group provide a report of its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening 6 7 of the 2011 Regular Session; and 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 9 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 10 Board of Land and Natural Resources, the Director of the 11 Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, and the State 12 13 Auditor. 14 Certin of 15 OFFERED BY: 16 17 18 BY REQUEST
