DESIGNATING THE WEEK THAT INCLUDES AUGUST 24TH AS SURF WEEK IN HAWAII.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, section 5-13.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, provides that surfing is adopted, established, and designated as the official individual sport of the State; and
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5	WHEREAS, he'e nalu, or surfing, was a sport originally
6	enjoyed by Hawaiian alii, and ultimately by commoners as well;

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9	WHEREAS, many Hawaiians believe that surfing has its roots
10	in the Kumulipo, the epic Hawaiian creation chant; and
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12	WHEREAS, in writing about the Kumulipo chant, Palani
13	Kanak'ole Kahahele stated that:
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15	The Kumulipo articulates and reveals the
16	connections of the sky and earth, the ocean and land
17	and man, the man and gods and returns again to repeat
18	the cycle with the sky and earth, who are the gods.
19	The Kumulipo recognized that the interrelationships of
20	all things in an everlasting continuum, it is
21	Ponahakeola, the chaotic whirlwind of life.
22	
23	The Kumulipo is the reality of our dim past, the
24	foundation for our present and the pathway into the
25	future. It is a cognizant reminder of our ancestors,
26	their intelligence, failure, conquest, and defeat.
27	This song is a gift which encourages the Warrior
28	within us to awake to the contests and challenges
29	which consistently confront us by using intelligence
30	and ancestral experiences. It is our genealogy
31	connecting mankind to earth and sky. You are the
