HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING THE EFFORTS OF THE COMMUNITY GROUP PLANNING THE CREATION OF A MONUMENT TO HONOR QUEEN KA`AHUMANU IN OR NEAR HANA, MAUI.

1 WHEREAS, various Pacific island chiefdoms were first 2 unified into the Kingdom of Hawai`i during the late 18th century 3 through conquest by the warrior who became the Kingdom's first 4 ruling monarch, known as King Kamehameha the Great, or 5 Kamehemaha I; and

7 WHEREAS, following the death of Kamehameha I in 1819, Queen
8 Ka`ahumanu, his first and favorite wife and close advisor,
9 became in effect the kuhina nui (co-ruler) of the Kingdom
10 together with the heir to the throne, Prince Liholiho (King
11 Kamehameha II); and

WHEREAS, upon the death of Liholiho in 1824 and the
succession of Liholiho's younger brother Kauikeaouli (Kamehemeha
III) to the throne, Queen Ka`ahumanu in effect ruled the Kingdom
as regent during the early years of Kauikeaouli's reign; and

18 WHEREAS, Queen Ka`ahumanu was a forceful person who exerted 19 great impact, influence, and power during much of the Kingdom's 20 existence, as an advisor and co-leader with kings, as a free-21 spirited challenger of traditional kapu, and as a catalyst and 22 shaper of the evolving relationship between ancient Hawaiian and 23 more recently arrived Christian beliefs, morals, and 24 spirituality; and

26 WHEREAS, Queen Ka`ahumanu was born around 1770 of 27 Ke`eaumoku and Namahana in the cave at Pu`u Ka`uiki, near Hana 28 on the island of Maui and taken as an infant to Heaiu Kaniomoku 29 at Hana; and

1 WHEREAS, the Kingdom of Hawai`i, and successor governments, 2 including the Territory of Hawai`i and the State of Hawai`i, 3 have built monuments honoring persons of importance in Hawaiian 4 history, including King Kamehameha the Great, King Kalakaua, 5 Queen Kapi`olani, Queen Lili`uokalani, Father Damien, Robert 6 Kalanihiapo Wilcox, and Prince Kuhio; and

8 WHEREAS, although a statue of Queen Ka`ahumanu already 9 exists at the Queen Ka`ahumanu Center in Kahului, Maui, a 10 monument to the Queen at or near Hana, Maui, the area of her 11 birth, paying tribute to and memorializing her valued 12 contributions to the Kingdom of Hawai`i and the history of 13 Hawai`i, would be appropriate and would benefit our current 14 residents and visitors alike; now, therefore, 15

16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 17 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 18 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that state agencies, private 19 businesses, and the community organizations are requested to 20 cooperate with and support the community group planning the 21 creation of a monument to honor Queen Ka`ahumanu in or near 22 Hana, Maui; and

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 25 Natural Resources is requested to assist the community group in 26 locating and setting aside an appropriate piece of public land 27 for the placement of the Queen Kaahumanu monument; and

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, 30 Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian 31 Affairs, Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, 32 33 President of the Royal Order of Kamehameha, Presidents of Chapters I and XI of the `Ahahui Ka`ahumanu Society, Chairperson 34 of the State Council of Hawaiian Homestead Associations, 35 36 President of the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs, Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of Kamehameha Schools, 37 Native Hawaiian Culture and Arts Program of the Bishop Museum, 38 39 President of the Queen Lili`uokalani Children's Center, and President of the Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement. 40
