HOUSE RESOLUTION

ESTABLISHING AN INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE TO INVESTIGATE THE COUNTY OF HAWAII DEPARTMENT OF WATER SUPPLY.

1 2	WHEREAS, the United States Geological Survey reports that fresh ground-water withdrawals on the island of Hawaii during

4 5 6 7 8 9 10	WHEREAS, withdrawals for public supply in 1995 were about 23 million gallons per day, withdrawals for agricultural use were about 13 million gallons per day, and withdrawals for domestic and commercial uses were about 6 million gallons per day; and
11 12 13 14	WHEREAS, \$6 million was allocated to build a water system in or around the Ocean View-Kahuku area on the island of Hawaii; and
15 16 17 18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, the money was released to Mayor Harry Kim's administration and then from the Office of the Mayor to the County of Hawaii Department of Water Supply (DWS) which employed SSFM International to engage in planning and construction of the project and to conduct the required environmental assessment (EA), which has since been approved; and
22 23 24 25 26	WHEREAS, an extended delay ensued after the EA was approved concerning appropriate tanks needed for the project, location of the fill outlets and generally, the timeline for the completion of the project; and

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(7) The investigative committee may continue beyond the 1 periods set forth in paragraph (6) for the purpose of 2 monitoring and, if necessary, to propose the amendment 3 4 or repeal of any legislation enacted as a result of 5 the committee's efforts; 6 7 now, therefore, 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Procurement Office 10 (SPO), with its own staff and other support staff is requested to gather, analyze, and interpret the information submitted to 11 12 the investigative committee, and report this information to the 13 investigative committee; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the SPO is further requested to work under the direction of the investigative committee and 16 provide such technical, staffing, and other assistance to the 17 investigative committee as may be necessary, including providing 18 19 assistance in collecting, reviewing, analyzing, and interpreting 20 documents, testimony, and other evidence obtained by the 21 committee, and in coordinating the day-to-day work of the 22 committee; and 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference 24 Bureau is requested to assist the investigative committee in 25 conducting legal and policy analyses, as appropriate, including 26 a review of laws and studies in other jurisdictions, to the 27 28 extent this work is not conducted by the Attorney General, and in drafting appropriate implementing legislation as requested by 29 the committee; and 30 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of the Attorney General is requested to provide the investigative committee with 33 34 copies of documents as may be available, and in providing legal analyses as needed, to the extent that the Attorney General's 35 36 participation in the work of the committee does not conflict with any litigation of which the Attorney General is a party; 37 38 and 39 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all other departments, agencies, and offices of the State, as appropriate, are 41





1 requested to cooperate with and provide assistance to the investigative committee with respect to its investigation; and 2 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the investigative committee 5 shall submit to the House of Representatives a report no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 6 7 2011; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Chair of the Board of Water 10 Supply, Manager of County of Hawaii Department of Water Supply, 11 12 Mayor of the County of Hawaii, the Governor, Comptroller, 13 Administrator of the State Procurement Office, Hawaii County Legislative Auditor, and Attorney General. 14 15
