## HOUSE RESOLUTION

DECLARING THE SECOND WEEK IN OCTOBER AS CASE MANAGEMENT WEEK.

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization has defined "health" 1 2 as "a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity;" and 3 4 WHEREAS, the issues of health and access to healthcare have 5 been the topic of much current debate both on a national and 6 7 state level; and 8 WHEREAS, the modern healthcare environment is a maze of 9 complex medical, social, and fiscal considerations; and 10 11 WHEREAS, case management is a collaborative process that 12 includes assessment, planning, facilitation, and advocacy for 13 options and services, to meet an individual's health needs; and 14 15 WHEREAS, case managers provide critical services on a daily 16 basis to help patients and their caregivers navigate the modern 17 healthcare landscape to better achieve their healthcare goals; 18 19 and 20 WHEREAS, while pursuing their primary goal of effective 21 patient care, case managers advocate for patient needs, develop 22 an individualized plan of care, coordinate services between 23 providers, and facilitate the scheduling of services; and 24 25 WHEREAS, in addition to helping patients achieve wellness 26 and autonomy, case managers are also adept at ensuring that 27 available resources are being used in a timely and cost-28 effective manner to obtain optimum value for both the client and 29 the reimbursement source; and 30 WHEREAS, case management has grown substantially as a 31 profession over the past decade, with over 40,000 practitioners 32 holding a Certified Case Manager credential; and 33 34



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WHEREAS, case managers can be found in multiple settings 1 including government agencies, health insurance companies, 2 3 hospitals, and private managed care companies; now, therefore, 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 6 of 2010, that the second week in October, beginning with Sunday, 7 be designated "Case Management Week," to recognize the case 8 management profession as a unique and effective way to mobilize 9 resources to promote cost-effective, quality outcomes for a wide 10 11 range of populations with varied healthcare needs; and 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this celebratory week should 13 include activities that recognize the contributions and 14 commitments case managers make to their clients, in addition to 15 educating the public, caregivers, healthcare industry, and 16 elected officials about the significant work performed by these 17 dedicated healthcare professionals; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 20 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Health, 21 Director of Human Services, and the Hawaii Chapter of the Case 22 Management Society of America. 23 24 25 26 OFFERED BY:
