HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO IMPLEMENT A STATEWIDE PLAN TO ELIMINATE THE WASTE OF MILK DISTRIBUTED WITH SCHOOL LUNCHES.

1 WHEREAS, 42 United States Code 1758 requires that schools participating in the National School Lunch Program offer 2 students fluid milk in a variety of fat contents with their 3 school lunches; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the National School Lunch Program currently allows 6 7 substitutions and waivers of the fluid milk requirement under certain circumstances, such as students with disabilities, 8 9 medical needs, or special dietary needs; and 10 WHEREAS, few students in Hawaii public schools are awarded 11 substitutions and waivers for milk and, according to the 12 Department of Education, conditions such as lactose intolerance 13 do not qualify students for waivers; and 14 15 WHEREAS, some of the milk that is distributed with school 16 lunches in Hawaii's public schools is not consumed and is thrown 17 away instead, wasting valuable state funds and opportunities for 18 students to consume nutritious beverages with their lunches; 19 20 now, therefore, 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 22 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 23 of 2010, that the Department of Education is urged to develop 24 and implement a statewide plan using existing resources to 25 eliminate the waste of milk that is distributed with school 26 lunches by the 2010-2011 school year; and 27 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 30 requested to provide a report to this body detailing the current amount of milk distributed that is wasted, the statewide plan to 31 eliminate the waste of milk, and an estimate of the resulting 32 cost savings no later than sixty days prior to the first day of 33 instruction of the 2010-2011 school year; and 34 35
