REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO DISSEMINATE INFORMATION, INCLUDING VACCINES FOR FEMALES BETWEEN THE AGES OF 9 TO 26 YEARS, TO BETTER PREVENT AND ERADICATE CERVICAL CANCER CASES IN HAWAI`I.

WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society Cancer Facts & Figures
2009 reports that 11,270 women in the United States will
contract cervical cancer and 4,070 are estimated to die from
this disease; and

WHEREAS, the report states that the "Society's prevention 6 programs focus on preventing the use of tobacco products; 7 8 educating individuals ... about the relationship between weight control, diet, physical activity, and cancer; reducing excessive 9 sun exposure; and encouraging individuals to follow the 10 Society's guidelines for preventive screenings for colorectal 11 and cervical cancers, as well as vaccination against human 12 papillomavirus (HPV) to prevent cervical cancer"; and 13 14

15 WHEREAS, many pharmaceutical companies are developing HPV 16 vaccinations, but the report points out that "the FDA has 17 approved Gardasil, the first vaccine developed to prevent the 18 most common HPV infections that cause cervical cancer for use in 19 females aged 9 to 26 years"; and

WHEREAS, in January 2007, "the American Cancer Society 21 Guideline for Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccine Use to Prevent 22 Cervical Cancer and Its Precursors ... show that the vaccine has 23 the potential to prevent up to 70% of the more than 11,000 24 25 invasive cervical cancers and 3,600 cervical cancer deaths in the US each year. Routine use of the HPV vaccine, coupled with 26 continued screening according to ACS guidelines, has the 27 potential to greatly reduce the occurrence of cervical cancer"; 28 and 29
