HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF DEFENSE FOR HEALTH AFFAIRS OF THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE TO REVISE THE PRIORITIES FOR ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE AT MILITARY HEALTH FACILITIES TO GIVE MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL GUARD WHO ARE INJURED IN ANY DUTY STATUS THE SAME PRIORITY AS ACTIVE DUTY MILITARY MEMBERS.

1 WHEREAS, the United States Department of Defense determines access to healthcare for military health facilities; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, priorities for healthcare are determined by beneficiary category as determined by the Department of Defense; 5 6 and 7 8 WHEREAS, those seeking healthcare must be verified for eligibility and meet criteria for priority based on their 9 status; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, National Guard members who did not retire due to medical condition or length of service, have become veterans who 13 also served on active duty, and were disabled, are in a category 14 that is of less priority than those who have not served in the 15 line of duty; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, current priorities for access to healthcare at 19 military health facilities such as Tripler Army Medical Center 20 are: 21 22 (1) Active military; 23 24 Active duty family member; 25 26 (3) Retiree enrolled in Tricare prime; 27 28 (4) Retiree dependant or survivors enrolled in Tricare 29 prime; 30

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(6) Retiree dependant or survivor not enrolled in Tricare prime; and

7 WHEREAS, members of the National Guard who are injured in 8 the line of duty are generally not included in the foregoing 9 priorities; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 11 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 12 of 2010, that the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Health 13 Affairs of the United States Department of Defense is requested 14 to revise the priorities for access to health care at military 15 health facilities to give members of the National Guard who are 16 injured in the line of duty while in any duty status the same 17 priority as active duty military members; and 18

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 21 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States, 22 the United States Secretary of Defense, the Assistant Secretary 23 of Defense for Health Affairs, and the members of Hawaii's 24 congressional delegation.
