HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO ESTABLISH AN ILLEGAL MOPED HOTLINE.

1 2	WHEREAS, as the economic downturn continues to affect many state residents are looking at ways they can reduce their
3	monthly expenses; and
4 5	WHEREAS, one way people are seeking to reduce their
6 7	expenses is by reducing their daily transportation costs; and
8 9	WHEREAS, residents are increasingly turning to mopeds as their means of transportation because of their high miles per
10	gallon fuel use and low maintenance costs; and
11 12 13 14	WHEREAS, moped registrations in the State of Hawaii continue to rise and are now over 23,000; and
15 16 17	WHEREAS, many users of mopeds, particularly young adults, choose to illegally retrofit their mopeds to make them faster and louder; and
18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, illegally retrofitted mopeds are oftentimes more dangerous to riders and pose a public nuisance to neighbors and communities where these mopeds are being used; now, therefore
22 23 24 25	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, that a hotline be created within the Department of
26 27 28 29	Transportation so that residents can call in to anonymously report disturbing and dangerous mopeds that are in violation of Chapter 291-191 of the Hawaii Revised Statues; and
30 31	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the informant chooses to pass along information of a violation of this chapter



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1 anonymously, such information shall be transmitted to the police 2 department of the county the informant resides in, and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the task force consist of the Director of Transportation Services or his designee; who shall 5 serve as the chairperson, a representative from each of the four 6 counties' transportation departments, a member of the moped 7 industry; as selected by industry members, the Attorney General 8 or his designee, a representative from each of the four 9 counties' police department, and a representative from the 10 Department of Motor Vehicles Budget and Finance office, and 11 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the department assign one 14 representative whose duty shall include the investigation of 15 moped violations; and 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 17 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the mayor of the City 18 and County of Honolulu, the mayor of the County of Hawaii, the 19 20 mayor of the County of Maui, and the mayor of the County of Kauai. 21 22 23 24 OFFERED BY:
