HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT EACH COUNTY ESTABLISH AN ILLEGAL FIREWORKS HOTLINE PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, fireworks are used throughout the state of Hawaii 1 as a means of celebration and festivity for social, cultural, 2 and recreational purposes; and 3 4 WHEREAS, in many instances residents use illegal fireworks 5 6 that not only are a public nuisance to residents, but cause 7 serious injury to those who use them improperly or without the 8 necessary knowledge; and 9 WHEREAS, in recent years the number of illegal fireworks 10 11 used throughout the state has grown exponentially, with the number of permits to use fireworks legally lessening year by 12 13 year and last year; and 14 WHEREAS, in a 2009 arrest the police - working with the 15 Fire Department, U.S. Customs and Border Protection, Coast Guard 16 and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives -17 recovered 589 cases of illegal fireworks weighing 13,400 pounds 18 19 with a street value of about \$150,000 to \$200,000; and 20 WHEREAS, fireworks, especially those that are deemed 21 illegal cause discomfort and distress to young children, 22 individuals suffering from disabilities, pets, senior citizens, 23 and those suffering from asthma and respiratory illnesses; and 24 25 WHEREAS, in December of 2009, Honolulu Police Department 26 27 Chief of Police Louis Kealoha issued a public statement asking for the public's help in catching culprits that are using 28 illegal fireworks; now, therefore, 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 31 32 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, that each county is requested to establish, through 33

county ordinance, an illegal fireworks hotline program to report 1 2 violations of Section 132D-5 of the Hawaii Revised Statues; and 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each county make available a 4 5 confidential an illegal fireworks hotline for the purpose of accepting calls from persons wishing to report use of illegal 6 fireworks, and that an informant calling into the fireworks 7 hotline may pass along information of a violation of this 8 chapter anonymously or not; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there be established within the 11 12 state fire council for administrative purposes an illegal fireworks hotline to stop the importation of illegal fireworks, 13 14 and 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the informant chooses to 16 pass along information of a violation of this chapter 17 anonymously, such information be transmitted to the police 18 19 department of the county the informant resides in, and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each county is requested to 22 assign one representative whose duty shall include the investigation of firework use violations; and 23 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Mayor of the City 26 and County of Honolulu, the Mayor of the County of Hawaii, the 27 Mayor of the County of Maui, and the Mayor of the County of 28 29 Kauai. 30 31 32 OFFERED BY: athis thides
