## HOUSE RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING THE UNITED STATES BUREAU OF THE CENSUS AND URGING ALL HAWAII RESIDENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN 2010.

WHEREAS, the United States Constitution requires a national 1 census, which is a count of everyone residing in the nation, 2 3 once every ten years; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the first census in the United States took place in 1790 to determine the number of seats each state would have 6 in the U.S. House of Representatives; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, the census was also created to gain a better 10 understanding of where people lived and to establish patterns of 11 settlement as the nation grew; and 12 13 WHEREAS, census data are used for a number of public purposes including forecasting future transportation needs, 14 15 providing evidence in litigation involving land use, voting rights, and equal opportunity, determining areas eligible for 16 housing assistance and rehabilitation loans, directing funds for 17 services for people in poverty, and planning for hospitals, 18 nursing homes, clinics, and the location of other health 19 20 services; and 21 WHEREAS, the allocation of federal and state funding for 22 23 critical social services and other public purposes depends on complete and accurate age, population, and demographic 24 information; and 25 26 WHEREAS, every year, the federal government can allocate 27 28 more than \$300 billion to states and communities based, in part, 29 on census data; and 30 WHEREAS, census data also determines how many seats each 31 state will have in the United States House of Representatives, 32 making a complete and accurate count vital to fair 33 34 representation; and

WHEREAS, the 2010 census will be taken on April 1, 2010, 1 with a ten-question questionnaire delivered or mailed to 2 3 households in March 2010; and 4 5 WHEREAS, federal law requires each resident over 18 years 6 of age to fill out the census questionnaire truthfully or be 7 subject to a \$100 fine; and 8 WHEREAS, every Census Bureau worker takes a lifetime oath 9 to protect confidentiality to ensure that data identifying 10 respondents and their households are not released or shared for 11 a period of 72 years; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, this oath means that identity information will not be shared with anyone, including other federal agencies and law 15 enforcement; now, therefore, 16 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 18 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 19 of 2010, that this body supports the efforts of the United 20 States Bureau of the Census to achieve a complete and accurate 21 22 census; and 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all of Hawaii's residents are 24 25 encouraged to "Be Counted in 2010" by filling out their tenquestion questionnaire when it arrives; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that local governments, community-28 29 based organizations, faith-based organizations, schools, media, 30 businesses, and others are urged to help raise awareness of the vital role of an accurate census, and to encourage full 31 32 participation; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Hawaii's 35 36 Congressional delegation, Superintendent of Education, Director of Business, Economic Development & Tourism, Mayor of each 37 County, President of the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii, Editor 38 in Chiefs of the Star Bulletin and Honolulu Advertiser, and the 39 Partnership Specialist at the Honolulu Local Census Office. 40 41 42 43 FEB 0 1 201 HR HMS 2009-4994
