HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE COUNTIES TO REQUIRE EVIDENCE OF SUFFICIENT SPACE TO PARK A RECREATIONAL VEHICLE WHEN A PERSON APPLIES TO REGISTER THE VEHICLE.

WHEREAS, the number of motor vehicles in the State 1 2 increases every year, resulting in traffic and congestion on 3 neighborhood streets from vehicles parked on the street; and 4 WHEREAS, recreational vehicles are more than twice the size 5 of standard cars and sport utility vehicles, making them too 6٦ 7 large to park in many garages and driveways; and 8 9 WHEREAS, in some residential neighborhoods with narrow streets, vehicles larger than a standard car or sport utility 10 vehicle that park on the street impede residents from ingress 11 and egress from their driveways to the main roads; and 12 13 WHEREAS, large vehicles, including recreational vehicles, 14 15 that are parked on the street also pose potential safety hazards by obstructing the view of drivers of oncoming traffic when the 16 driver attempts to make a turn onto another road; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the owner of a vehicle should be responsible for the recreational vehicle and park the vehicle on the owner's 20 21 property instead of on the street; now, therefore, 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 24 of 2010, that this body requests the counties to require 25 evidence of sufficient space on private property to park a 26 27 recreational vehicle when a person applies to register the 28 vehicle with the county agency responsible for motor vehicle 29 registration; and
