## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE ON THE FEASIBILITY OF INCREASING THE NUMBER OF INSTRUCTIONAL HOURS IN EACH SCHOOL DAY.

WHEREAS, student test scores are used to determine whether 1 public schools meet their adequate yearly progress targets under 2 the federal No Child Left Behind Act; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, in the last three school years, the number of Hawaii public schools that have met adequate yearly progress 6 7 requirements has declined; and 8 9 WHEREAS, for the 2008-2009 school year, of the two hundred 10 eighty-four public schools in Hawaii, only ninety-seven schools met adequate yearly progress requirements, and ninety-one 11 schools must undergo restructuring; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the current budget crisis has resulted in teacher 14 furloughs, which reduced the number of instructional days by 15 seventeen days in each of the 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 school 16 years; and 17 18 WHEREAS, due to teacher furloughs, Hawaii now has the 19 shortest school year in the country; and 20 21 WHEREAS, schools on the mainland have extended the length 22 of their school days to approximately eight hours a day, which 23 24 includes one recess and lunch break; and 25 26 WHEREAS, Hawaii public schools offer as little as five hours of instruction per school day; and 27 28 WHEREAS, increasing the number of instructional hours in 29 each school day would provide public school students with a 30

greater opportunity to learn and may raise student test scores; 1 2 now, therefore, 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 5 of 2010, that the Department of Education is requested to report 6 7 to the Legislature on the feasibility of increasing the number of instructional hours in each school day; and 8 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is requested to submit its report, including any proposed 11 legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 12 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011; and 13 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of 16 Education and the Superintendent of Education. 17 18 19 20 OFFERED BY: man Manmat Nemme moun Hiele HR LRB 10-1685.doc
