## HOUSE RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING APRIL AS SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS AND PREVENTION MONTH.

WHEREAS, sexual assault affects women, men, and children of 1 2 all racial, social, religious, age, ethnic, and economic groups in the United States; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, on average, one person is sexually assaulted in the United States every two and a half minutes; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, one in six women and one in 33 men have been the 9 victim of rape or attempted rape; and 10 WHEREAS, the Department of Defense received 2,688 reports 11 of sexual assault involving members of the Armed Forces in 12 13 fiscal year 2007; and 14 WHEREAS, the rate of reported forcible rape, including 15 assaults and attempts to commit rape by force in the State of 16 Hawaii increased 3.9 percent from 2006 to 2007; and 17 18 WHEREAS, only 41 percent of sexual assault victims pursue 19 prosecution by reporting their attacks to law enforcement 20 agencies; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, sexual assault survivors suffer emotional scars long after the physical scars have healed; and 24 25 WHEREAS, prevention education programs carried out by rape 26 27 crisis and women's health centers have the potential to reduce the prevalence of sexual assault in their communities; now, 28 therefore, 29

Executive Director of the Hawaii State Coalition Against
Domestic Violence.
