HOUSE RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING INCREASING FEDERAL REIMBURSEMENT RATES FOR SCHOOL MEALS.

WHEREAS, millions of children every day eat lunch, and 1 sometimes breakfast, at school, yet currently the United States 2 Department of Agriculture invests only \$2.68 on average per day 3 for each eligible student's school lunch; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, this is not enough money to ensure our children 7 are being fed high quality, healthy meals; and 8 WHEREAS, thirty per cent of America's children are 9 10 overweight and providing these children with cheap, unhealthy food only contributes to the problem; and 11 12 WHEREAS, many children are growing up without the skills 13 they need to choose healthy foods; and 14 15 WHEREAS, projections indicate that for children born after 16 2000, one out of every three Caucasians and one out of every two 17 18 Blacks and Hispanics may develop diabetes in their lifetime, many before they graduate from high school; and 19 20 WHEREAS, this year, the United States Congress has an 21 22 opportunity to transform the way American children eat when it 23 reauthorizes federal child nutrition programs; now, therefore, 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 25 26 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, that the Hawaii State Legislature supports increasing 27 federal reimbursement rates for school meals by one dollar per 28 29 day per child to improve the nutritional quality of school meals; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii State Legislature 32 supports implementation of the proposed Institute of Medicine 33 34 School Food Guidelines to ensure that increased funding is equated to healthier food; and 35 36
