HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE FORMATION OF A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP A STRATEGY TO ATTRACT AND RETAIN LOCAL ENERGY SERVICE COMPANIES TO PERFORM WORK ON STATE CONTRACTS.

WHEREAS, Hawaii continues to produce and support local 1 companies that advance cutting-edge approaches to make 2 government, business, and other private ventures more energy 3 efficient in order to save the State money and resources; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Hawaii is home to a number of competitive energy 6 7 services companies that contribute to the overall workforce of our State as well as the expansion of the "green" economy; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has an interest in making the facilities it owns and leases more energy efficient to save 11 taxpayer dollars; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the state procurement code generally requires that 14 agencies award contracts for energy efficiency projects to the 15 16 lowest bidder; and 17 WHEREAS, low-bid contracts for energy efficiency projects 18 do not necessarily result in the best efficiency for the State; 19 20 and 21 WHEREAS, in 2008, the Department of Accounting and General 22 Services adopted a list of preferred vendors for retrofitting 23 state offices and buildings with energy efficient lighting 24 fixtures; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, a majority of the pre-qualified vendors are based on the mainland United States, and, therefore much of the 28 revenue from the services being purchased by the State leaves 29 the State; and 30 31 32 WHEREAS, many of the vendors pre-qualified by the Department of Accounting and General Services depend on smaller 33

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1 local vendors in order to fulfill their contracts with the 2 State; and 3 4 WHEREAS, these local vendors are qualified, technically and 5 financially, to undertake energy retrofit projects that would normally go to larger out-of-state vendors; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, it is in the State's interest to nurture and grow 9 the engineering, design, and financial capabilities of local energy services companies so that they may employ more of 10 Hawaii's intellectual labor resources; now, therefore, 11 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 14 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, that the Department of Accounting and General Services, 15 the Administrator of the State Procurement Office, the 16 17 University of Hawaii Procurement Institute, the High Technology Development Corporation, and other interested parties are 18 requested to form a working group to develop a strategy to 19 attract and retain local energy service companies to perform 20 work on state contracts; and 21 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group's assessments are requested to include, but not be limited to: 24 25 26 (1)Examining ways to incentivize partnerships between 27 local and out-of-state companies for energy efficiency projects at state facilities; 28 29 30 (2) Determining whether state contracts for energy efficiency projects may be divided into "large" and 31 "small" contracts to enable local energy service 32 companies to compete more aggressively for state 33 34 projects; for example, whether Hawaii based energy 35 services companies can be given preference for state 36 projects that are five hundred thousand square feet or less; 37 38 39 (3) Examine whether the criteria for being included on the Department of Accounting and General Services 40 "preferred vendor" list of energy services companies 41 42 unfairly limits local companies from competing for state contracts; 43 44



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- (4) Developing procurement policies for state energy efficiency contracts that will provide more benefits for local energy services companies; and
- (5) Examining the benefits of requiring the State to allow locally-owned energy services companies to provide direct services to the State to assess, design, and implement energy-saving projects and use municipal leases as the project funding source; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to submit a report of its findings to the Legislature not later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011; and

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 17 Resolution be transmitted to the Comptroller, the Administrator 18 of the State Procurement Office, the Director of the University 19 of Hawaii Procurement Institute, the Executive Director of the 20 High Technology Development Corporation, the Hawaii District 21 Director of the Small Business Administration, and the President 22 of the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii.
