HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING STATE PUBLIC ENTITIES TO COMMIT TO HEALTHIER AND MORE NUTRITIOUS MEALS IN THEIR PROGRAMS BY SPENDING MORE OF THEIR FOOD DOLLARS FOR LOCALLY-PRODUCED PRODUCE OR OTHER HAWAII AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS.

WHEREAS, Hawaii is heavily dependent on imported food to 1 feed its residents, with an estimated 85 to 90 percent of the 2 food consumed in the state imported; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, Hawaii residents spend an estimated \$3,700,000,000 6 annually on food, and if some of the dollars spent on imported food were invested in locally produced food, it would yield 7 multiple benefits to Hawaii's economy; and 8 9 WHEREAS, a recent publication by the University of Hawaii 10 College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources and the 11 State Department of Agriculture evaluates the economic 12 multiplier effects of increasing food self-sufficiency in 13 14 Hawaii's economy; and 15 WHEREAS, assuming that 85 percent of the food consumed in 16 17 Hawaii is imported, \$3,100,000,000 is leaving the State to support agribusinesses elsewhere, and replacing just ten percent 18 19 of these imported foods - assuming appropriate resources and infrastructures are available for such an expansion - would 20 amount to some \$313,000,000, or \$94,000,000 at the farm gate, 21 22 given a 30 percent farm share; and 23 24 WHEREAS, taking into account the multiplier effects, this 25 \$94,000,000 would generate an estimated economy-wide impact of \$188,000,000 in sales, \$47,000,000 in earnings, \$6,000,000 in 26 state tax revenues and more than 2,300 jobs; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, other non-monetary benefits include better 30 environmental stewardship, reduced risk of invasive species, and land preservation; now, therefore, 31 32 33

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 1 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 2 of 2010, that the University of Hawaii, Department of Education, 3 4 Hawaii Health Systems Corporation and other state public entities are requested to commit to healthier and more 5 nutritious meals in their programs by spending 6 percent of their food dollars for locally-produced produce or other Hawaii 7 agricultural products; and 8

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these agencies submit a report 11 to the Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the Regular 12 Session of 2011 on the status of their respective purchases and 13 use of locally-produced produce or other Hawaii agricultural 14 products and any recommendations for improvements in meeting 15 this goal; and
