HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTS THE OFFICE OF THE AUDITOR TO REVIEW AND COMPARE THE HEALTH CARE BENEFITS AVAILABLE UNDER THE MEDICAID PROGRAM, THE PREPAID HEALTH CARE ACT, AND THE HEALTH CARE PROGRAMS OF THE EMPLOYER-UNION TRUST FUND.

WHEREAS, under the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act, many 1 2 employees and their families are able to receive health care benefits by paying for a portion of the health care premium with 3 the remainder being paid for by their employers; and 4 5 WHEREAS, despite the broad coverage of the Hawaii Prepaid 6 Health Care Act, there are still many employees who are not able 7 or eligible to receive health care benefits; and 8 9 WHEREAS, employees of the State of Hawaii and the counties 10 are able to receive health care benefits for themselves and 11 their families through health care plans offered by the 12 Employer-Union Trust Fund (EUTF) by paying for a portion of the 13 premium in a manner similar to the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care 14 Act with the State and counties paying the remainder; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii and the counties, as the 17 former employers of state and county retirees, provide health 18 care plans through the EUTF by paying all or part of the health 19 care premium for eligible retirees and their families; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii and the counties pay hundreds 22 of millions of dollars in health care premiums for their 23 24 employees and retirees through the EUTF without being able to leverage these funds to keep costs down; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, under the federal Medicaid program, states can receive a waiver under Section 1115, U.S.C.A. Title 42, to 28 expand Medicaid coverage to families earning up to three hundred 29 per cent of the federal poverty level; and 30 31 32 WHEREAS, under the Medicaid program, states must contribute a percentage of the funds, known as the state match, to pay for 33 the health care benefits provided; and 34

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1 2 WHEREAS, some current public sector employees and many public sector retirees earn less than three hundred per cent of 3 the federal poverty level and the moneys used by the state and 4 counties to pay for health care through the EUTF could be 5 leveraged and used as the state match to provide coverage under 6 Medicaid for eligible public sector employees and retirees; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, the health care benefits provided under the Medicaid Program are similar to the benefits available under the 10 Prepaid Health Care Act and the health care programs of the 11 EUTF; now, therefore, 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 14 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 15 of 2010, that the Office of the Auditor is requested to review 16 the health care benefits available under the Medicaid Program, 17 the Prepaid Health Care Act, and the health care programs of the 18 EUTF and report where the benefits provided are the same and 19 where they differ, and whether the benefits under the Medicaid 20 Program can be made similar to the benefits available under the 21 Prepaid Health Care Act and the health care programs of the 22 23 EUTF; and 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of the Auditor is 25 requested to review the scope of the Medicaid Waiver Program or 26 any program in the Medicaid Act which allows for expansion of 27 coverage to determine the feasibility of: 28 29 (1)Covering private sector employees and their families 30 earning less than three hundred per cent of the 31 federal poverty level under the Medicaid Act 32 regardless of whether the employee is currently 33 covered under the Prepaid Health Care Act; 34 35 Using the amount of the employer's payment for (2)36 coverage under the Prepaid Health Care Act to 37 reimburse the State for its portion of the state match 38 in order to pay for coverage of private employees who 39 are eligible for Medicaid because they earn less than 40 three hundred per cent of the federal poverty level; 41 42 Covering public sector employees and their families 43 (3) earning less than three hundred per cent of the 44



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2 whether the employee is currently covered under health care programs provided by the EUTF; 3 4 (4) Covering public sector retirees and their families 5 earning less than three hundred per cent of the 6 7 federal poverty level under Medicaid regardless of whether the retiree is currently covered under health 8 care programs provided by the EUTF; and 9 10 Using state and county funds currently used to pay for (5) 11 the health care programs under the EUTF as the state 12 match for Medicaid; and 13 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of the Auditor is requested to submit its report to the Legislature on the above 16 matters no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the 17 2011 Regular Session of the Legislature; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 20 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the Senate, the 21 Speaker of the House of Representatives, the State Auditor, 22 and the Director of Health. 23 24 25 26 OFFERED BY:
